In addition, we invite all the teams that are members of the Latinum Certamen to participate in XXII Latin Countries Cup 2016.

We also would like to welcome all orienteers from the other parts of the world and invite them to take part at the South American Open Orienteering Championship.

Each competition will have the following races:

Sprint: Individual race for all categories. Short distance in an urban area.

Middle Distance: Individual race for all categories. Woodland area with a vast variety of vegetation.

Long Distance: Individual race for all categories. Woodland area with a vast variety of vegetation.

The Middle Distance has the status of WRE and according to IOF rules it will allow the athletes of category W/M21E



Valparaiso welcomes you all to its wonderful and breathtaking scenery. All competitions will take place in this important Chilean county. The Sprint competition will be held within the urban area of Valparaiso Downtown, whereas the Middle and Long Distance will take place in the National Park Reserva Forestal Lago Peñuelas nearby Valparaiso. Location and Embargoed Areas


The embargoed areas are shown on the map (marked with magenta colour). According to the IOF rules it is prohibited to carry out any orienteering event from this publication to the date of the event. It is also prohibited to organize training or field surveys, inspections or other activities that would generate benefits for athletes who participate or perform these activities.

Maps

For all three competitions athletes will have new orienteering maps consistent with the rules of the IOF. Sprint race will be held with a map of scale 1:4,000 or 1:5,000 (ISSOM standard), while for the Middle and Long Distance races maps of either 1:10,000 or 1:15,000 scale will be used. These maps will be printed with 'offset' method.

Punching System

The SPORTident punching system will be used and manual punches will be present at each control marker for backup.

Orienteers who will use their own SIcard shall indicate the ID in the entry form when registering. Athletes who don't have a Slcard may rent one from the organization.

SIcard 8, 9, 10 and 11 may be used.





Ceremonies and Meetings

There will be organized a solemn opening ceremony for the South American Orienteering Championship and Latin Countries Cup with the participation of all delegations. The place for this ceremony will be announced in the next bulletin.

The closing ceremony will be held immediately after the awards ceremony at the end of the middle distance race on Sunday October 30th directly in competition arena.

In addition, the Chilean Orienteering Federation invites to the annual meeting of Latin Countries Cup, as well as a meeting of leaders of South American orienteering federations. The place of the meetings will be reported in the next bulletin.

Awards

SAOC2016: Medals will be awarded to the first three places in each category for each race and diplomas to the first 6 places. The winners get the Title of South American Champion in Orienteering.

SAYOC2016: Medals will be awarded to the first three places in each category for each race and diplomas to the first 6 places. The winners get the Title of South American Youth Champion in Orienteering.

CPL2016: Medals will be awarded to the first three places in each category for each race and diplomas to the first 6 places. Besides the Latin Countries Cup to the winning country and special trophies will be awarded to the top 5 countries.

ASO2016: Medals will be awarded to the first three places in each category for each race and diplomas to the first 6 places.

Training

The organization will prepare a model event and training maps will be delivered to each registered competitor. The training can be performed by all athletes on Thursday 27th of October from 10:00 until 18:00. The organization will provide shuttle service from the Event Centre to the training area.

Winning Times

The winning times for all courses will be designed according to the IOF and Latin Countries Cup rules.

Terrains

The Middle and Long Distance competitions will be held in areas with moderate relief of hills, depressions and ravines. The vegetation is very diverse and has grasslands, areas with low vegetation and dense forests of pine, eucalyptus and native trees. In the National Park there is the lake Peñuelas, which is not suitable for swimming.

At the time of competition there may be breeding grounds of protected species, which eventually may be marked as prohibited areas in the competition maps.

Sprint competition will take place in a heritage urban area with large numbers of tourists and visitors and little traffic. Traffic safety will be organized in places where needed.

Climate and Hazards

This time of year is late spring in Chile. Daytime temperatures reach 23-24 °C, while the night temperatures are from 8-9 °C. In October in Valparaiso the weather is mostly sunny. But there are also days with cloudy sky and rarely it may be rainy.

No special hazards of any kind are present in the area of competition, understanding that Chile is a seismic country with the corresponding risks. The organization will include all the necessary security measures required in Chile for these cases and make public the rules of behaviour in case of a seismic events.

For the South American Open Orienteering Championship clubs and federations shall send the entries indicating sub-categories E, A, B or N (beginners).

If necessary additional categories higher than W/M65 will be opened.

The organization may join categories depending on the number of entrants, in which case the affected athletes will be informed properly.

Additionally a "Family" recreational category will be opened with no age restrictions, which allows participation of family groups.

Entries

For entries you should consider the following:

- a) Entry will be open from March 1, 2016 on the site http://www.saoc2016.cl.
- b) Entries of athletes in the W/M21E categories for the WRE Middle Distance race must be made via Eventor IOF.
- c) Only members of the South American orienteering federations of categories W/M21E may register for the South American Orienteering Championship SAOC2016.
- d) Only members of the South American orienteering federations of categories W/M20E and W/M18E may register for the South American Youth Championship SAYOC2016.
- e) Athletes which are members of the teams participating in the Latin Countries Cup CPL2016 must register but will not pay entry fee.
- f) South American athletes of categories W/M21E, W/M20E and W/M18E which are registered for SAOC2016 or SAYOC2016 may also register as members of their country's teams for CPL2016.
- g) Members of other non-South American federations may join the entries for the South American Open Orienteering Championship ASO2016.
- h) It is possible to register for one, two or all three races (Sprint, Long Distance and Middle Distance).
- Entries are only valid after payment of the entry fee. Payments will be accepted via the online registration and payment i) system which will be available when entries open.

*Note: Payment for transportation service is not mandatory. For competitors who have their own vehicle the organization will publish parking in the areas of competition.

The organization has SIcard 8 which may be rented at a cost of USD1.50 for every competition in which competitors participate.

For the categories under 18 the organization will provide SIcard rentals at no cost.

In case of loss of a rented SIcard a replacement cost will be charged.

Food and Lodging

In the next bulletin we will publish more details for accommodation and food. Valparaiso, the host city is an UNESCO World Heritage City and boasts a large number of hotels, hostels and tourist accommodation. The costs of these accommodations can range from USD 30,00 to USD 120,00 per person per night. In the event website will be published links with detailed information.

The organization will provide "hard ground" plus information on camping, hostels or hotels with special pricing for participants.

Food in Chile is varied and generally prices range between 5,00 and 15,00 dollars in restaurants.

Note: Tickets will be given to entrants which have registered for transportation service. If there are free quotas it will be possible to purchase tickets on site at an additional cost.

Each competitor participates in the event at his own risk. However the organization will provide first aid in case of accidents.

How to get there?

Arrival by plane: Chile Santiago International Airport. From the airport shuttle services by Turbus (www.turbus.cl) every 20 minutes to Terminal Alameda (reference value USD 2,5) are available. Travel time is 20 minutes. At Terminal Alameda you can find several bus lines with regular service to Valparaiso. Another option is the regular shuttle CentroPuerto (www.centropuerto.cl) from the airport to the Metro and Bus station Pajaritos, from where several bus lines to Valparaiso leave (USD 2,2 reference value). The journey from the airport to Terminal Alameda in taxi has a referential cost of USD 20,00.

Arrival by bus: Valparaiso is 130 km from Santiago. From Terminals Alameda or Pajaritos buses of different intercity lines to Valparaiso leaves every 30 minutes. The cost of this trip is about 8,5 USD. These buses arrive at the "Bus Station" of Valparaiso, in front of the National Congress, where you can take public transportation to the Event Centre. The vast majority of lines indicating "Playa Ancha" or "Molo - Park" as part of its route reach the university district and the Event Centre, with a cost of not more than 1,0 USD. The journey from "Valparaiso Bus Station" to the Event Centre in taxi has a referential cost of 12, 0 USD.

Participation and Teams

Each country may present a team of three women and men:

- WOMAN AND MAN SENIOR
- WOMAN AND MAN JUNIOR
- WOMAN AND MAN CADET

The entrants from each team will compete on the same courses as W/M21 E, W/M20 E and W/M18 E, so that races of South American athletes are also valid for the South American Orienteering Championships and the South American Youth Orienteering Championship and may score for WRE.

A team will be able to compete if at least one representative is registered.

CPL regulations apply according to their latest update after the meeting in Chiny (Belgium) in 2015.



Costs

As statet in the "Entries" section of this bulletin, there will be no entry fee for team members who register as part of their national teams, with the exception of South American athletes who also participate in the South American Orienteering Championships.

The registration deadlines are the same as indicated in the section "Entries" of this bulletin.
