The development of the town of Bom Despacho began around the bridge of the Lambari River, in the road that came from town. From there it stretched westward until it reaches the Picão's water spring. Later it advanced to Piraquara's farm and, finally, reached the São Francisco River, in the western extreme of the town.

When the gold's fever ceased, in the second half of the seventeenth century, there was a decadence of Pitangui as well as the entire region. Many of those who lived there moved to the region between the Lambari and São Francisco Rivers, aiming to survive by means of other economic activities. Initially, *quilombos* emerged, formed by blacks escaped slaves from the mines and farms of Pitangui.

In a short time the *quilombos* were liquidated and the conquered areas were granted as *sesmarias*. Thus the first farms for cattle raising were founded. In 1770, Captain Francisco de Sa is mentioned as the first cattle rancher, owner of the Picão's farm. From then on the occupation process had intensified, with the emerging of new farms, extending until the end of that century.

At about this time a chapel was erected which became a polarizing centre. Over the years it was surrounded by other buildings, such as houses, ranches, and trading houses, favouring the formation of Nossa *Senhora do Bom Despacho* camp.

The origin of the camp name is controversial. One theory attributes it to the devotion of the founder of the chapel, Luiz Ribeiro da Silva. Like other Portuguese settlers from western Minas Gerais, he came from the province of Minho, northern Portugal, where there was a fervent cult of Nossa Senhora do Bom Despacho.

Another possibility says that the denomination came from a prolonged drought between 1767 and 1770, penalizing people, animals and crops. Then, the devotees of Nossa Senhora do Bom Despacho made supplications and prayers, asking for rain. Certain that their prayers were attended, because the rain arrived soon, they built the chapel.

It was between 1801 and 1831 that the camp began to develop its potential. The mainly economic activity was cattle raising, followed by the production of *rapadura* and brandy, as well as rice, maize, cassava and cotton crops. In 1812, the camp built around the Chapel of Bom Despacho, through the royal letter, upgraded its status to civilian institution.

With the evolution of urban contours, resulting from the development of the local commerce and productive sector, the community had claimed for years the promotion of the camp to a category of village, without results. The municipality was only created in 1911 when it dismembered from the town of Santo Antônio do Monte. The village was installed on June 1st, 1912, counting with two districts: Bom Despacho and Engenho do Ribeiro.

Nowadays, the city of Bom Despacho is known regionally for housing the 7th Police Battalion and the 28th Regional Police of the Civil Police. This makes this city a strategic placement related to security activities developed by the State.

Bom Despacho is also part of the footwear pole of Nova Serrana. The dynamics created by this industry in the center-west of Minas Gerais reflects directly in Bom Despacho, since the distance between these two cities is only 37 km (Source: Rogério César Corgosinho, 2013).

History and Culture

The city has a Railway Museum, where you can see the history of the municipality that was once an economic center of the Minas Gerais's Central West Region. At the time of the gold exploration period, there was a large state railway junction, which developed the city in its earliest times.



In the region you can also visit the city of Itapecerica, Pitangui and Quartel Geral, with their still preserved old houses from the time of the Brazilian Empire.






