^{*}Registered participants will be eligible for the Asian Cup points.

- 1. All competitors must be citizens with passports from the country they represent.
- 2. Competitors representing the IOF member federations, defined by the International Olympic Committee as belonging to the Asian continent, can compete in AsOC&JYOC.
- 3. Competitors representing the IOF federations of other Member States or other Asian countries can participate in AsOC&JYOC but are not eligible for Asian titles, medals or diplomas.
- 4. Federations may enter up to 10 men and 10 women in M/W21 Elite class and 6 men and 6 women in M/W16E, M/W18E and M/W20E of the individual competitions, however, only 6 men and 6 women can start in the M/W21E individual classes.
- 5. In the Middle Relay competitions, a federation may enter a maximum of 2 teams in each gender category, but only the better-placed team will be counted in the prize list.
- 6. In M/W 16/18/20 E class, if a federation is unable to form full relay teams (even with women running in men's classes), it may form incomplete teams or mixed teams with runners from other federations. Under no circumstances may persons other than entered competitors participate in the competition. Teams with runners from more than one federation are not placed on the official result list.



Sprint Distance – POSTECH(Pohang University of Science and Technology)

Scale: 1:4,000 / Contour Interval 2.5m

New map is produced in 2020 in accordance to ISSprOM2019





The Sprint competition will be held at the university campus. Many university buildings, such as lecture hall, research center, and dormitories, are arranged. And auxiliary facilities such as sports facilities, landscape facilities, parking lots, ponds, and vegetation areas also exist.

School facilities are located on a gentle southeast slope (50m Altitude) and Vegetation areas have generally good visibility and runnability. But some are natural forests, so it's hard to run a little.

There are several roads and parking lots in the campus. There is not much traffic, but the competitors must be careful of access to the vehicle. You should also be care about making the noise around the dormitory.



Middle Distance & Middle Relay- Heunghae

Scale: 1:10,000 / Contour Interval 5m

1:7,500 enlarged maps for junior and senior classes (in open classes)

The middle and middle relay venues, with the exception of some areas, consist of relatively gentle terrain with altitude 40 meters or less.

The narrow valleys and small forest paths have been developed, requiring detailed map reading. And there are many pine trees and bamboo. Visibility and runnability are generally good, but deviations vary by area. Generally, it is a gentle terrain, but there are some steep slopes, closed quarries, deep waterways, etc., so care must be taken.

Old maps of the terrain will be uploaded to the AsOC&JYOC website.





Competition Rules

The 2019 International Oriented Federation Foot Orienteering Competition Rules, with Appendix 9 for the Asian Orienteering Championships and Appendix 10 for the Asian Junior and Youth Orienting Championships are in effect.

Punching System

The SPORTident system will be used in all competitions.

Rental of SPORTident card may be arranged upon request with a rental charge of KRW 10, 000 won per card for all the competitions.

The card shall be returned to the organizer at the end of the competition. KRW 60,000 will be charged on each card lost or damaged.

Clothing

For AsOC&JYOC 2020, there is no clothing regulation. However, full body cover is recommended for both middle and middle relay distance event. No spikes are allowed in the sprint distance competition.

Model Event

The sprint and middle model event will be held on May 1, 2020 in the same venue.

It will be held on Hwarang village and nearby forests, and technical model events will be held at the same venue.

The official package includes cost of the model event.

For non-package-using competitors, a map will be purchased (KRW 12,000) at the Event Center on the model event day.

Anti-Doping

The Organizer and all participants must comply with the IOF anti-doping rules during the AsOC&JYOC 2020 competition.

Climate

The climate of Pohang City, where the competition is held, is a marine climate, and in May there is often a small amount of topographical precipitation due to the northeast wind and humid air. Temperatures usually range from 10 to 26°C, and sometimes rise to 30°C.

Accommodation & Meals ···

The official accommodation is offered at Kensington Resort in Gyeongju-city. Meals are provided from dinner of April 30 to breakfast of May 6, except the lunch of May 4 (rest day). Breakfast and dinner will be served by buffet style.





There are two types; one is two room unit and the other is twin bed room, both has toilet and facilitated kitchen.

The unit consist of two rooms and large living room. The units are Korean style ondol room and thin mattresses and blanket will be offered instead of beds. For the unit, we will accommodate 3 to 6 people (i.e., up to 3 person in one room) and are randomly assigned by organizers.

Twin room will be arranged with an additional 15,000 won per day and person. Twin rooms are available on a first-come, first-served basis as the number of rooms is limited. There are not many shops around the resort, but there are some convenient facilities in the Kensington Resort. For example, convenience stores, game centers, the shops of the chicken, pizza, laundry, karaoke... etc.

Transport

Shuttle bus will be provided from Shingyeongju station(KTX train) and Gyeongju bus terminal to the accommodation on arrival day (Apr. 30) and departure day (May 6).

From accommodation to model event and to terrains can be made by shuttle buses included in the transportation package.

How to get to Gyeongju City

1. From Seoul

It takes 2 hours from Seoul station to Singyeongju station by KTX train which is 19 times a day. From Apr. 30 to May 6, it's a public holiday in Korea. So please make a reservation in advance in case the seats will be sold out.

Besides the train, there are express bus from Seoul express bus terminal to Gyeongju bus terminal (3 hours and 30 minutes, 17 times a day).

2. From Busan

If you use Gimhae Int'l airport, you can take a limousine bus to Gyeongju bus terminal. (1 hour and 10 minutes, 20 times a day).

Training Camp

Training camps will be held from April 29 to 30 for two days. It will be held not far from the middle distance terrain and details as follows.

-April 29 (Wed): Arrival, Middle Distances (Pohang City)

-April 30 (Thu): Middle Distances (Pohang City)

-Cost: KRW 150,000 (include accommodation, transportation, meals from dinner of Apr.29 to lunch of Apr.30)

Accommodation is the same as Event Center (Kensington Resort).

On arrival day(Apr.29), free shuttle bus will be provided from Shingyeongju station(KTX train) and Gyeongju bus terminal to the accommodation.

Rest Day Activities

Plan A - Geongju City Orienteering

It is an orienteering event that uses maps and compasses to find hidden attractions in downtown Gyeongju. A souvenir will be provided to the runner, and the runners can have some free time for sightseeing after the competition.

-Time: 10:00 to 12:00 (after 12, it's free time)

The shuttle bus departure time for return will be announced later.

-Cost: KRW 25,000 (without lunch)

Plan B - Geongju City Tour

It's a program to tour the representative attraction of Gyeongju city, which has a thousand year of history and a UNESCO world heritage course.

-Course: Bulguksa Temple, Seokguram Rock, Daeneongwon (Cheonmachong), Bunhwangsa Temple, Taejong Muyeol Royal Tomb.

-Time: 10:00 to 17:00

-Cost (without lunch): KRW 40,000 or KRW 35,000(under age 19)

There will be some free time for having lunch.
