WELCOME

It is a great pleasure for us to welcome you all to Belgrade for the Pro Serbia 2020. We are the proud to organise competition in a beautiful and historic city.

Belgrade is the capital city of Serbia. It is located at the confluence of the Sava and Danube rivers and the crossroads of the Pannonian Plain and the Balkan Peninsula. The urban area of Belgrade has a population of 1.23 million, while within administrative limits of the City of Belgrade live nearly 1.7 million people, a quarter of total population of Serbia.

Belgrade has a few historic fortresses well known as Kalemegdan and Gardos. City of Belgrade is great orienteering center for sprint distance with more than 30 sprint orienteering maps in less than 30 minutes drive. If you are searching for preparation for your team we can manage to make a sprint camp for you and your team.

As you already know, Belgrade is home to European university games, in which orienteering will be one of the sports from 20th to 25th July. That means that you have 8 days of high level orienteering in same place!

How can you run Knockout sprint?

While registering for competition:

(e.g. M18) chose Day 1 M18

Day 2 M21E

First 30-40 competitors can qualify for Knockout sprint (depends from number of competitors registered).

If you are not interested in Knockout sprint there will be race for every class between Semifinals and Finals of Knockout sprint, you just need to register normally for the competition.

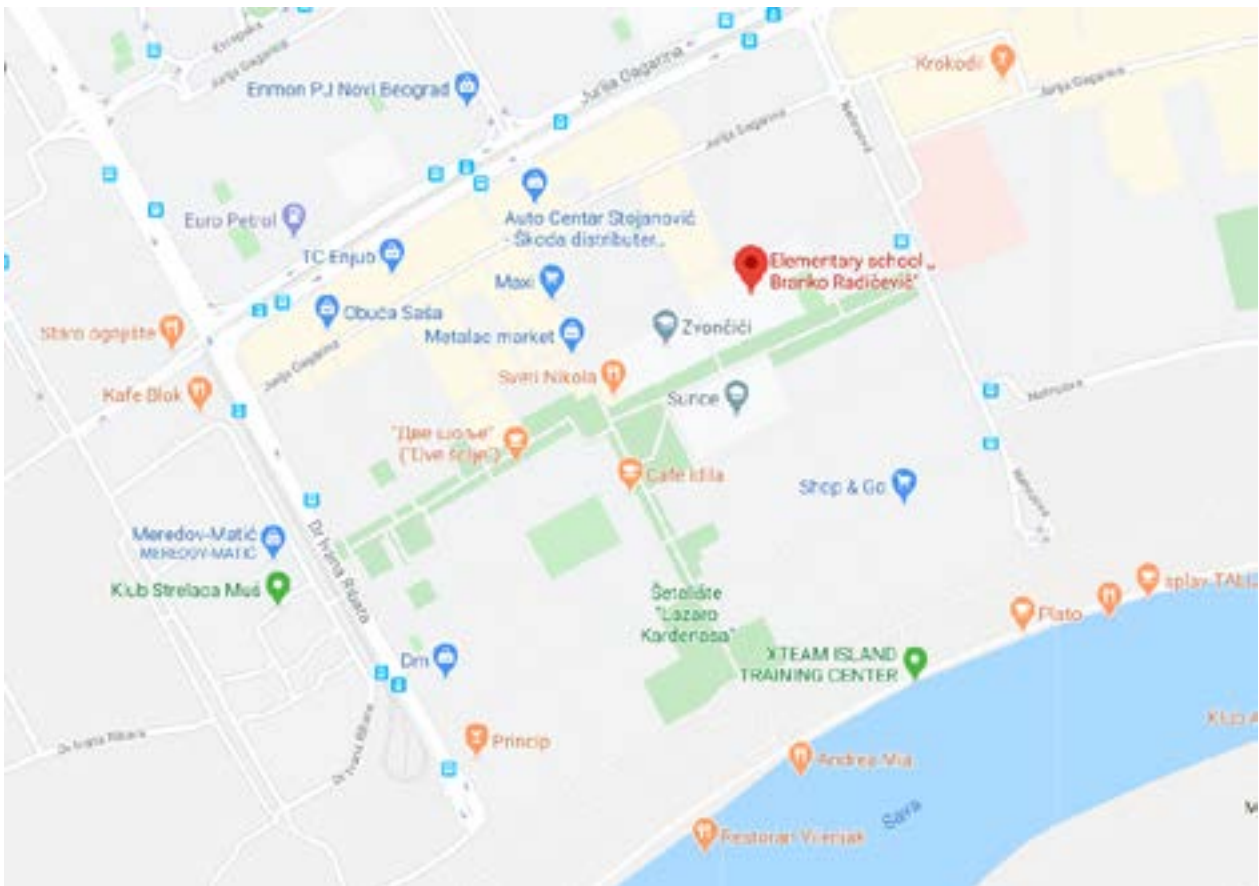

Knockout sprint system:

Day 1 will be ranking race for Knockout sprint. Winner of

M18-20-21A-21B-21E-35

and W18-20-21A-21B-21E-35

will be ranked as 1st for Knockout sprint. If you are not running Day 1, you can still run Knock-out sprint, only your rank will be set to the lowest value.

Example

If there is 30 competitors in Knockout sprint groups will be separated (based on ranking race) as following:

Quarterfinals (winning time 8-9 minutes)

Quarterfinal A	QA:	1st,	10th	11th	20th	21st	30th

Semifinals (winning time 9-10 minutes)

Semifinals are for 12 competitors. First 2 competitors from each quarterfinal and also 2 “lucky losers”. Lucky losers (LL) are competitors who have best 2 ranks in overall quarterfinal results and in the same time not qualified by placement to the semifinals.

Semifinal A:	QA1st	QA2nd	QB1st	QB2nd	QC2nd	LL 11th
Semifinal B:	QD1st	QD2nd	QE1st	QE2nd	QC1st	LL 12th

Finals (winning time 11-12 minutes)

Final is for 6 competitors. First 2 competitors from each semifinal and also 2 LL. LL are competitors who have best 2 ranks in overall semifinal results and in the same time not qualified by placement to the final.

Every starting group (Quarterfinals, Semifinals, Final) are mass- start with identical courses, **no forking**.

Quarterfinals are for first 30-40 competitors from qualification race. Everybody else will run normal sprint between semifinals and finals.

Semifinals are for 12-15 people from quarterfinals

Finals are for 6-8 people from semifinals

if there is a lot competitors at quarterfinals we will make 3 semifinals.

Information about Belgrade

The nearest airport is Belgrade International Airport 'Nikola Tesla', around 15 km from the competition races. There are low cost flights to Belgrade if one of your chosen carriers are Fly Dubai, Air Serbia, Easy Jet or WizzAir. There are more than 30 different air carriers flying to Belgrade.

Alternatively, there is an airport in Nis with another low-cost carrier Ryanair, from where you can reach the EC by bus.

There are large accommodation capacities of every type in Belgrade, ranging from inexpensive hostels and motels, authentic 'ethnic style' accommodation, to luxurious suits and five-star hotels.

If you want the best alternative to expensive hotels in Belgrade, taking an apartment in Belgrade is probably the best option. Prices of Belgrade apartments depend on the duration of your stay as well as location, however, you can get premium quality accommodation at hostel-like prices. A very popular website for finding apartments in Belgrade is worldwide favourite AirBnB.

Tourist attractions in the vicinity:

- Belgrade fortress - Kalemegdan (Mix relay terrain for University games)
- Avala mountain - Mountain in city limits with amazing view from Avala Tower
- Temple of Saint Sava - Largest Serbian Ortodox church
- Knez Mihajlova street - perfect place for coffee
- Skadarlija street - place with many traditional restaurants
- Kosutnjak - (Middle distance terrain for University games)
- Stark Arena - (Sprint distance terrain for University games)
- Gardos tower - perfect view of Belgrade
- Ada ciganlija - artificial swimming lake



What others say about New Belgrade

Many guidebooks are quick to dismiss New Belgrade as a 'soulless concrete sham' but doing so disregards some of the best restaurants and parks in the entire city. Visitors who decide against venturing to the left bank of the Sava River are condemning themselves to a life without Belgrade's best food and arguably it's most genuine experience. Restaurants like Durmitor, Cirilica and Cosi are among the best in the city, and there is also an entire street dedicated to fast food. If you're looking for the 'Real Belgrade', this is exactly where to find it.

There are plenty of things to check out in New Belgrade, too. The Western City Gate (known locally simply as 'Genex') is one of the most recognisable structures in the city, resembling what one assumes aliens would have designed if they were involved in the New Belgrade construction boom.

Belgrade's Museum of Contemporary Art is also here, along with the huge Sava Centre and Ušće Tower. It isn't all buildings of course, and the Park of Friendship is a large green expanse along the bank of the Danube river.

New Belgrade doesn't carry a great reputation with many locals either, although a lot of this comes from a perceived reputation as opposed to actual experience. If you are visiting Belgrade and want to be surrounded by a decent standard of living, great restaurants, plenty of coffee, space and the best walking spots in the city, this is where you want to be.
