Cansiglio is a historical and natural heritage of great value, known in particular for its forest: in addition to its productive (wood) and protective (soil protection) function, the forest today has an important recreational and social tourism role, dictated by the need for a reconnection with nature, which must, however, be carried out in an environmentally sustainable way, with a low anthropic impact and in full respect of the places in order to preserve the precious animal and plant biodiversity.

Among the ecosystem services provided by the forest, the model of conscious tourism oriented to environmental sustainability is what we want to promote in Cansiglio, prealpine highland between Veneto and Friuli Venezia Giulia, in the middle of the provinces of Belluno, Treviso and Pordenone. The Veneto part of the Cansiglio highland is a regional state-owned area covering about 4500 hectares, managed by Veneto Agricoltura, characterized not only by meadows and pastures and nature reserves, but also by one of the most important beech and fir forests in Europe.

The Cansiglio Forest is a site of Community importance: in fact, being part of the Natura 2000 Network, this is a place of high botanical and faunal naturalistic excellence, and the presence of natural ecosystems has been guaranteed by centuries of careful land management, from the time of the Serenissima Republic of Venice to nowadays, with Veneto Agricoltura.

Orienteering is well suited both to this eco-friendly tourism approach and to the preservation of the biodiversity of the places where it is practiced: often this sport is nicknamed as "Sport of Woods" because the sporting facility is precisely the natural territory. This implies both a high environmental sensitivity by the participants along with a continuous search for new territories where this sport can be practiced. For this reason, the Cansiglio Forest is the ideal place to enjoy orienteering and in particular for high quality sports tourism, where athletes-tourists can appreciate not only very technical routes but also the natural beauties that the territory has to offer.

The international and Italian orienteering federations agreed to choose the Veneto region, and in particular the Cansiglio Forest, mainly due to previous experience and also for the high quality of sports facilities and nature landscape offered in this area. Among the other competitions, in May 2021 Cansiglio Forest hosted the Italian Orienteering Championships which represented a weekend of great satisfaction and success both for athletes and organizers.

Veneto Agricoltura therefore has the privilege of hosting the World Cup Finals of Orienteering from 30 September to 2 October: after Switzerland in the spring (May) and Sweden in the summer (August), Cansiglio in the fall will be the place dedicated to the competitions that will end in Cortina d'Ampezzo, distinguishing Veneto as a favorite place for mountain sports (also in view of the 2026 Winter Olympics).

We would like to thank in advance the organizing committee, which is making agreements with local administrations and bodies, institutions and also the great number of volunteers involved at various levels, in order to realize the event and maximize the promotion of the territory in an integrated way serve as a network with the other Venetian realities connected to Cansiglio. 3. VENUES, ACCESS, AND TRANSPORT

3.1 TRANSPORT

The Event will be located in Northern Italy. The Long- and Middle-distance races will be organised around Cansiglio Forest. The last competition, the Sprint Relay, will be held in the Olympic town of Cortina d'Ampezzo (Province of Belluno), 90 km from the Event Centre.



Nearest major airports are Venice Airport (70 km, 45 min by car) and Treviso Airport (60 km, 45 min). Airports of Verona and Bologna are within 2 hours and Milano-Bergamo is within 3 hours' drive.

We recommend using own transport or a rented car. When using public transport, nearest train station is Conegliano (all major trains stop) and Vittorio Veneto. From Conegliano and Vittorio Veneto to the Event Centre it is possible to take a bus (line 129).

During the event, the organisers will only provide compulsory transport from the quarantine to Start and Arena.

3.2 COMPETITION ARENAS

There will be two arenas used: the Long- and Middle-distance races will share an arena in Cansiglio forest, a separate arena will be used for the last competition, the Sprint Relay, which will be held in Cortina d'Ampezzo.

The Cansiglio's arena will be located at 46°03'32.5"N 12°24'03.4"E

The Cortina's arena will be located at 46°32'13.9"N 12°08'13.9"E

Late Entries and changes will be accepted, if possible, up to 29th September 2021, 12:00. No late entries or changes will be accepted after that time.

Late entries and changes will always have a defined extra cost (surcharge). Late entries and changes will always be treated equally and must be communicated directly to the organiser.

After deadlines the Organiser will update the IOF Eventor with accepted changes.

5.4 ACCREDITATION

To get accredited for the competitions, all competitors and support staff must follow the test procedure in the specific COVID-19 bulletin.

A personal ID card will be handed out with accreditation. All accredited persons must wear it at all relevant times and present it for access to authorized zones. The online entry form on Eventor requests that all persons to be accredited provide a personal portrait photo for use on the ID card.

With accreditation, every team receives a bag with the ID cards, bulletins, SIAC-punching cards, parking pass and model event maps.

Teams need to provide a telephone number so that the organizers can quickly contact key team officials if necessary.

7. EMBARGOED AREAS


The marked competition areas in Cansiglio Forest and in Cortina d'Ampezzo are embargoed. It is prohibited for competitors, team officials and others who, through knowledge of the terrain or the competitions, may influence the results of the competitions to enter the embargoed areas.


These embargoed areas are off limits until the day prior to the competition. On competition day, special rules set by the organiser will apply covering access to the competition areas and to quarantines (see 13. EVENT INFORMATION).

The model events maps are not anymore embargoed from Monday 27th September



An exception is Archerton map (marked in yellow below), which was released in May 2021 after the Italian Championships and is now open for trainings.





Information about embargoed areas is also published on the Event website and on the IOF website (Eventor).



7.1 PREVIOUS ORIENTEERING MAPS

There are previous orienteering maps from Cansiglio Forest. They can be downloaded from the IOF Eventor or the Event website. There is no previous map of Cortina d'Ampezzo.

8. TRAINING

For all forest competitions: Valsalega and Archerton maps are available for training.

Public race participation

Any athlete or a person, who are in the event bubble, could consider participation in the public races, however, they must start at least 30 minutes before the first starting slot (with the punching start) to ensure they don't contact the participants of the public races

9. RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

9.1 COMPETITON RULES

The Competition Rules for IOF Foot Orienteering Events 2021, valid from 1 January 2021 and the Special Rules for the 2021 Orienteering World Cup apply.

9.2 CLASSES AND PARTICIPATION RESTRICTIONS

There are two classes, Women and Men, for all individual races. For Sprint Relay competition each team consists of 4 runners: two men and two women.

Participation restrictions, classes and qualification system will follow the Special Rules for the 2021 World Cup in Orienteering.

9.3 ANTI-DOPING

Doping is strictly forbidden, and the organizers of the World Cup final are dedicated to supporting the Anti-Doping authorities in their work. Doping controls may be carried out any time during the competitions in accordance with the procedures described in the WADA International Standard of Testing and Investigations. The IOF Anti-Doping rules and the World Anti-Doping Code 2021 apply as of 1st of January 2021. Athletes who are selected for doping control must bring an official identification (with photo) to the doping test area. The athlete should also present the personal therapeutic use exemption (TUE) if applicable. In general, it is advisable that athletes takes their ID to all competitions and events. 9.4 INSURANCE

The organizers decline any liability that might occur through participation in World Cup Events and trainings. Each person participates at her/his own risk and is responsible for her/his own insurance coverage (illness and accident).

9.5 CLIMATE, HAZARDS

Average temperatures in Cansiglio at the beginning of October is between 10 and 20°C in daytime.

Ticks might represent some risk as they could transmit Boreliosis and Meningo-Encephalitis.

10. MEDIA SERVICES

10.1 REGISTRATION

We welcome all media representatives as our partners to broadcast the thrilling events of World Cup 2021 to a broad public.

10.2 LIVE PRODUCTION

There will be a live-productions from the Middle distance and the Sprint relay broadcasted on TV and on the Live Centre of the International Orienteering Federation. For the Long distance a free video streaming from the finish with arena audio will be available. For all the races live results will be available as well the GPS tracking.

During the competitions, athletes may encounter camera crews in the terrain. Camera controls and intermediate time controls are not marked on the control description. Athletes may also be followed by a running camera or by camera-drones during the race.

The drones will keep proper distance to the athletes.

Please note that photographs and footage will be taken throughout the World Cup Finals. These will be used by the event organization for marketing and publicity purpose in our publications, on our website and in social media or in any third-party publication during and after the Event. 11.1 PUNCHING SYSTEM, TIMING SYSTEM, GPS TRACKING

Punching

SPORTident Air+ punching will be used for all competitions. Every athlete will get primary SIAC on accreditation. On top of this the participants are requested to use their own SIAC cards during the event. It's not mandatory but highly recommended.

The primary SIAC's number will be used in timing software and also for proper name assignment for TV graphics and online split times. For these reasons it is very important to check you have the SIAC assigned to you before leaving to quarantine. For the backup SIAC the participants are kindly requested to put and to check their SIAC chip number on Eventor and at the accreditation.

So, in every race every participant will carry up to 2 SIACs - primary, which he/she will get on accreditation and as a backup his/her own SIAC. Please use these cards with SportIdent recommendations - see

https://www.sportident.com/documents/information_technical/SI_system_AIRplus/sportident_airplus_information_for_athletes.pdf

SIAC numbers will be checked at the accreditation and before the start.

Prior to the start, it is requested that you:

- 1. perform SIAC BATTERY TEST for both cards (available in pre-start)
- 2. CLEAR both cards
- 3. CHECK both cards
- 4. TEST both cards that they are working in contactless mode

During the race both cards must be carried on the same arm next to each other (e.g. on two fingers of one hand or finger and wrist, on the same arm).

When punching, it is the competitor's responsibility to receive feedback signals. It is not important whether the feedback is given by both cards or just one card; only in the case where the feedback is not received by either of them, the competitors should try to punch in a contact way (put one of the cards into the hole), and if this does not work, may punch manually (backup needle punch).

After crossing the finish line, both the SIAC cards will be read out. The reading from both cards will be merged together to form a complete set of punching records, which will be then evaluated.

Start timing

Long distance and middle distance

There will not be a start gate. It's the athlete's responsibility to start at the correct time. The start beep and a visible start clock will show the countdown to the starting. If the athlete starts before his/her start time, he or she will be disqualified.

Relay

Mass start. Listen to the commands of the start officials. Start signal will be given through the start official by a shot of a gun. Early start leads to disqualification.

Finish timing

Long and middle distance

The primary finish time will be taken using the SIAC with a ground antenna. In case of two SIACs with different times, the lesser time will be used

As backup system there will be two light beams mounted 70 cm and 110 cm above the ground (when the athletes are breaking both beams the time will stop)

If the primary SIAC timing fails for a single competitor, the backup timing from light beams will be used for that specific competitor. The time will be adjusted with the difference between the primary and the backup system, calculated as the average difference of the three previous recorded times

Relay

Finish time and order of teams to finish will be recorded and decided with a photo-finish camera by the jury when the chest of the runner crosses the finish line.

The race time for all events will be rounded down to the nearest second.

GPS tracking

GPS tracking services will be provided by TracTrac. GPS units will be given to selected athletes in all races. Names of the selected athletes will be published in quarantine.

It is mandatory for all selected runners to use the GPS. If a runner refuses to carry the device, the runner will be disqualified (\S 2.5, \S 2.6 and \S 26.10)

Please bring your own GPS-vest with you (hygienic reasons). The organiser provides GPS-vests only in exceptional cases. They will be handed out to the athlete for the whole event before the first use at the quarantine and must be returned on Sunday. Missing GPS-vests will be charged to the federations

Personal GPS data loggers are only allowed if they have no display or audible feedback. GPS watches are not allowed in all races (Rule 21.5 of the IOF rules for Foot-O events)



11.2 CLOTHING

It is forbidden to run with spike shoes. However, dobb spikes are allowed.

Otherwise, there are no regulations on clothing, but it is recommended to cover arms and legs in the forest race to avoid tick bites.

11.3 TEAM OFFICIALS' MEETINGS

All team officials' meetings will be held at Tarzo Audtorium Banca Prealpi with online transmission using "Microsoft Teams". Date, time, and link are as follow:

11.4 NEW COMPETITON MAPS

Team officials can get new competition maps at the Event Centre at the Arena or at the Event Centre in Tarzo

11.5 QUARANTINE

Arriving at the quarantine, the athletes must check in by showing their accreditation card and sign the list before the quarantine closes. No-one will be allowed into the quarantine area after the deadline

Warm-up maps for Long and Sprint Relay are considered as part of quarantine. Forest races quarantine is the same for Long and Middle and offer covered area/buildings and outdoor space. It is strongly recommended to stay outside to minimize the risk of COVID-19 infection

Toilets and water are available. Own team tents are allowed at the quarantine and in team zone in the arena. No own tent in the sprint relay arena or quarantine

Please respect the fairness rules in the quarantine and on the warm-up map. Team officials and athletes can leave quarantine at any time, but once they have left, they are not allowed to return

Please be fair and remember the following important things:

- The use of mobile phones, computers or any communication device inside the quarantine is strictly forbidden.
- It is not allowed to bring any maps into the guarantine zones.

• Due to COVID-19 reasons, stay within your own team only. Wear a mask at any time indoor or when interacting with organizers or other teams/athletes (checkin, bag drop, toilets, staircases, sports hall).

11.6 PRE-START AND START

The pre-start is marked on the warm-up map. There are toilets available at the middle buses drop off. Only athletes registered for that race have access beyond the pre-start. Once the athletes pass the pre-start, they are not allowed to go back to the quarantine.

It is the athlete's responsibility to watch for his/her start time. The time before start for the first call-up at the pre-start is 5 minutes for the individual competitions.

In mass start, the remaining time to the start will be announced in English. The start triangle is marked in the terrain by a control flag. The route to this flag is marked and compulsory for the athletes to follow all the way to the start point.

For specific details, see descriptions in each competition's section. The detailed start procedure will not be demonstrated.

11.7 LATE START

Athletes who are late for their start will be starting between the next start interval. If the lateness is the fault of the athletes, they will be timed as if they had started at their allocated start time. Athletes who are late through the fault of the organizer will be timed with their real start time.

11.8 COACHING ZONE

There will be a coaching zone at the long distance. Coaching zone is not in Arena, Coaches will be notified of the coaching zone by the organization staff present in the arena.

No coaching zone will be at the middle distance and sprint relay.

To ensure fair conditions, team officials in the coaching zone must not pass on information to competing athletes received from team-members that have already finished their races. Two accredited team officials are allowed inside the coaching zone.

11.9 FINISH

Athletes must follow the marked route from the last control to the finish.

After the finish, the athlete will be guided through the finish zone. She/He:

- Gets a new hygiene-mask.
- Download SIAC data.
- Returning GPS unit and vest (only after the last race if he/she has a borrowed vest)



- Can take refreshment (contact with the team official is possible).
- Goes forward to the mixed zone where journalists may ask questions and make short interviews.
- Takes her/his clothes/bag.
- Leaves the arena at the designated exit after cool-down and change of clothes.

Only the officially accredited team officials will have access to the finish zone to welcome incoming runners. Athletes shall be ready for live interviews with the speaker or TV.

11.10 OUT-OF-BOUNDS BOUNDARY OR AREA

Dangerous holes or areas in the forest (especially on middle map) can be taped with red and white stripes.

11.11 ABANDONING A RACE

Athletes who are forced to abandon a race must report to the finish staff and hand in their competition maps. A retiring athlete may not influence any other competitor.

11.12 MEDIA CONTROLS

Athletes may meet TV staff or journalists/photographers near control points, not marked in the control description. Controls may be guarded by the organizers.

11.13 CEREMONIES

Flower Ceremony

Only a few minutes after the conclusion of the middle race, there will be a flower ceremony for the best 3 athletes on the stage with live broadcasting on TV. Please be ready for this award if you are on the podium. No flower ceremony on Long Distance.

Prize giving ceremonies

Athletes ranked on positions 1 - 6 are kindly requested to line up behind the stage 10 minutes prior to the prize giving ceremonies. It is the athletes' responsibility to be there on time. Otherwise, an athlete will miss out on the prize money

Athletes taking part in the prize giving ceremony should wear their national team uniform.

Overall World Cup Price Giving Ceremony will be held in Cortina Arena both for Individual and Teams Competitions soon after the finish of price giving for Sprint Relay.

There will be a closing ceremony for World Cup 2021 at the end of all other price giving ceremony.

11.14 COMPLAINTS AND PROTESTS

Complaints/protest must be handed over in writing using the official form to an event official in the finish area at the info point no later than 15 minutes after the official results have been published (separately for women and men; announced by the speaker)


Roads to Forest Model Events



Coaches

Coaches can just drop athletes at the parking place for quarantine and drive to the competition arena by their own transport. Coaches are allowed to enter the quarantine zone until the deadline, by signing the quarantine check-in form. Coaches are allowed to the pre-start as well as this is inside quarantine.

Coaches can leave quarantine at any time after the deadline (10:30) and go to the competition arena by their own transport or walk to the Arena by the main road.

STARTING PROCEDURES

Prestart and start are very close, with insignificant climb. Call-up is at -5 minutes.



Distance from the start line to the start point: 100 meters.

Maps

Maps are in plastic bags (sealed). A label showing the bib number will be on the back of the map. Runners are responsible to control getting the correct map. There is a splitting system on both men and women courses, even if there is no map change, so different maps and control description are given to athletes.

Arena passage

There will not be an arena passage, but athletes will pass some hundred meters from arena. At this passage there will be a Coaching zone. Coaches will be notified of the coaching zone by the organization staff present in the arena.

Maximum running time 180 minutes.

Refreshment

There are 4 refreshment both for women and men, 3 of those at controls during the course and one is market on the map. Water is available at every refreshment, as well as a sport drink, which could be preliminary tested in the event centre as well as in the quarantine area.

It is possible for the teams to hand out personal drinks to the athletes during passage at coaching zone.

Refreshment are for men are at: before 25% - 35% - 45% - 85 % of their course. Refreshment are for women are at: before 25% - 37% - 48% - 80 % of their course.

Finish

Arena Cansiglio

No indoor facilities are available in the after-finish zone. There will be some tents in the Team zone. Teams are encouraged to put-up their own tents.

There are parking possibilities beside the road after the arena.

It is not allowed for teams to visit the finish area before their start, and it is not allowed for team officials to go to the quarantine / start / pre-start area if you have been at the finish area.

Cool-down zone

There is no cool-down map available at the finish, but there is plenty of space for cooling down in the finish area.


Coaches

Coaches can just drop athletes at the parking place for quarantine and drive to the competition arena by their own transport. Coaches are allowed to enter the quarantine zone until the deadline, by signing the quarantine check-in form. Coaches can leave quarantine at any time after the closure deadline (11:00) and go to the competition arena by their own transport or walk to the Arena by the main road. Coaches are allowed to the pre-start as well. In this case they must use official shuttle transport provided by organizers. Coaches go to the "bus stop" and wait for the first free place in a bus. But remember, once the person leaves the quarantine zone to the arena or by shuttle transport to the pre-start, she/he cannot go back. Same shuttle bus from the pre-start to the arena (together with athletes' baggage). If the coach decides to leave the pre-start to go to the arena, just go to the baggage drop and wait for the first free bus. No special coaching zone provided in the arena. No spectator passages.

Bags

Transport from the bus drop off to the team zone in the arena. Please leave your signed bags at the marked zone in bus drop off area. Please limit the size of your bags to avoid heavy transport. To be sure to have your bag at the after-finish team zone when arriving at the finish, you have to leave it at the baggage drop at least 30 minutes before your start.






Coming from south (from Vittorio Veneto, Cansiglio), at the round abound entering Cortina, turn left and after 100 mt you will reach Quarantine Parking



Coming from north you will pass inside embargoed area for competition, driving on the main road is allowed, but it is forbidden to stop or get out of the car before arriving at the south entrance roundabout in Cortina







Palestra Revis is a Gymnasium with Toilets and Showers inside. You can come back to the quarantine only after the finish of the race to have a shower.

Team parking in front of quarantine, reserved for teams (ask teams parking signs in event centre if you need more than the one in your accreditation bag). All cars from teams must be parked there, even from team officials going to the finish/arena.

Coaches are allowed to enter the quarantine zone until the deadline, by signing the quarantine check-in form. Coaches can leave quarantine at any time after the deadline and walk to the competition arena. Route for coaches to Arena will be marked on the west road on warm up map.

As we are in the town centre of Cortina, there are lot of possibilities to find a way to get in contact with athletes in quarantine or during the course. We still believe in the fairness of the teams and coaches not to leave the areas assigned to them or to avoid meeting their teammates.

Check-in

By signing-in at the quarantine by 13:00 at the latest. There you will receive your number bib and the warm-up map

Warm-up map and area

Located within the quarantine. Entering quarantine, you will receive a warm-up map, also showing prestart area. The warm-up map is without controls. You are not allowed to leave the area marked on the map.

From the warm-up area the athletes could come up to the map distribution point, which is less than 100 metres from the quarantine and 20 metres from the changeover/start. From that position they could also follow the arena passage of their teammates. Once they take the map, they must enter the changeover area and stay there till their start.

No toilets available in Arena

Starting procedures

GPS units are given in the quarantine.

Mass start will be at 13:35. The call-up is at -10 min before the mass start

The runner takes his/her rolled map from the map holders. It is not allowed to open the roll before the start signal

Distance from the start line/change-over to the start point: 50 meters

Change-Over

The entrance to the waiting zone is at the map distribution point. It is the athlete responsibility to be on time at the waiting zone. Disposal of the hygienic mask on the way to the change-over area

When your team member arrives, you may step to the change-over barrier. The change-over is done after crossing the finish line by hand touch across a separation barrier. The outgoing running athlete can open the map immediately after the change-over. Athletes can enter touching hand area just when they see their teammate passing in arena before the last loop

Maps

The maps are rolled and closed with a rubber band and have a white paper over. In the waiting zone it is the athlete's responsibility to take the correct map from the map holder themselves.

The initial part of the course is on outer side of the roll, covered by a blank sheet with the team and leg numbers. The maps are marked with a combination of team and leg number. Example for team 210: [210-1], [210-2], [210-3], [210-4]

You will keep the rolled map in your hand until you can start. You are allowed to remove the rubber band and the white sheet only after your teammate has punched the last control point before the finish. The map must remain rolled before the start.

The controls numbers on the map show both sequence number and control code.



Map Exchange

There is a map exchange during the race for both women and men. The second part of the course is on the backside of the map. So just turn the map. The start of the second part is marked with a start symbol on the map and is at the same place as the last control of the first part. Control numbers are continuous.

Reserve Maps

Reserve maps are ready nearby the waiting zone. Please contact the organizer as soon as you have noticed that your map is not on the map holder anymore.

Arena passage

There will be an arena passage. The passage will be clearly marked on the map and on the ground.

Maximum running time 90 minutes.

Finish











Crossable Fences

Special Passage (mandatory route)



Building on a mandatory route. the part inside of the building is only mapped generically (multilevel not possible to map correctly) and do not respect reality but the route inside is mandatory. Athletes has to punch the control just before the enter of the building, follow the mandatory route, punch a control inside the building, and continue following the mandatory route until outside of the building. Normal race restart at the exit of the building. Example of the course and mapping above.
