3. VENUES, ACCESS AND TRANSPORT

Davos Klosters is easily reachable by train or rental car from the airports Zurich and Basel. The competitions are held within the two towns Davos and Klosters.

There is no official accommodation, but Davos Klosters offers lots of possibilities.

There will not be any official transport to the competitions, teams in hotels will receive a Tourist Card with free travel in the region by public transport (train,bus). All event venues are reachable with public transport, so it is not absolutely necessary to hire a rental car.

Please note that we will offer a World Cup dinner and fare-well party as well as training days for WOC 2023 after the EGK Orienteering World Cup Final. It will be very difficult anyway to travel home on Monday evening. Take your time to prolong your stay in Switzerland, you will not regret it.

The Event Centre will be located in Davos. More information will be given in Bulletin 3.

5. ENTRY

5.1 ENTRIES AND ENTRY DEADLINES

All entries are only to be made in IOF Eventor. The entry form is available on <https://eventor.orienteering.org/Events/Show/7039>

- The deadline for Team Size Entry is 31 July 2022 (- 2 months)
- The deadline for Team Names Entry is 21 September 2022 (- 10 days)
- The deadline for Late Entries, Changes of Team Size or Team Names is 30 September 2022 at 12:00

Team Size Entry (deadline 31 July 2022)

The following information shall be filled in:

Team manager (chosen from list in IOF Eventor)

- Number of Team athletes (Men and Women)
- Number of Team officials
- Number of Team athletes in the individual races: Federation Team Quota will be published by the IOF.
- There is no maximum number of officials per team.

Team Names Entry (deadline 21 September 2022)

The following information shall be filled in:

Name of each Team athlete and official by selecting from federation members in IOF Eventor.

Competition Entries

Names of the competitors and, if required, their starting group, shall be entered in IOF Eventor before 12:00 on the day before the competition for the relay and before 18:00 for the individual competitions.

Late Entries, Changes of Team Size or Team Names

Late Entries and changes will be accepted, if possible, up to one day before event start date, 30 September 2022 at 12:00.

No late entries or changes will be accepted after that date. Late entries and changes will always have a defined extra cost (surcharge). Late entries and changes will always be treated equally and must be communicated directly to the organizer

The organizer makes the changes in IOF Eventor after deadlines.

5.2 ENTRY FEES UNTIL 31 JULY 2022

Competition package:

CHF 160.- for competitors and CHF 80.- for team officials

This includes:

Starting fee for all 3 races (competitors only), training maps, competition maps and two dinners (Saturday and Monday).

5.3 PAYMENT

The competition package must be paid by 31 July 2022.

6. ACCOMMODATION AND FOOD

There is no official accommodation provided from the organizer. Davos and Klosters offer a great number of hotel, guest rooms and apartments. Booking can be done directly through <https://www.davos.ch/en/>.

There are 130 beds available for the EGK Orienteering World Cup Final at the youth hostel of Davos. The price is CHF 45.-/bed including breakfast. 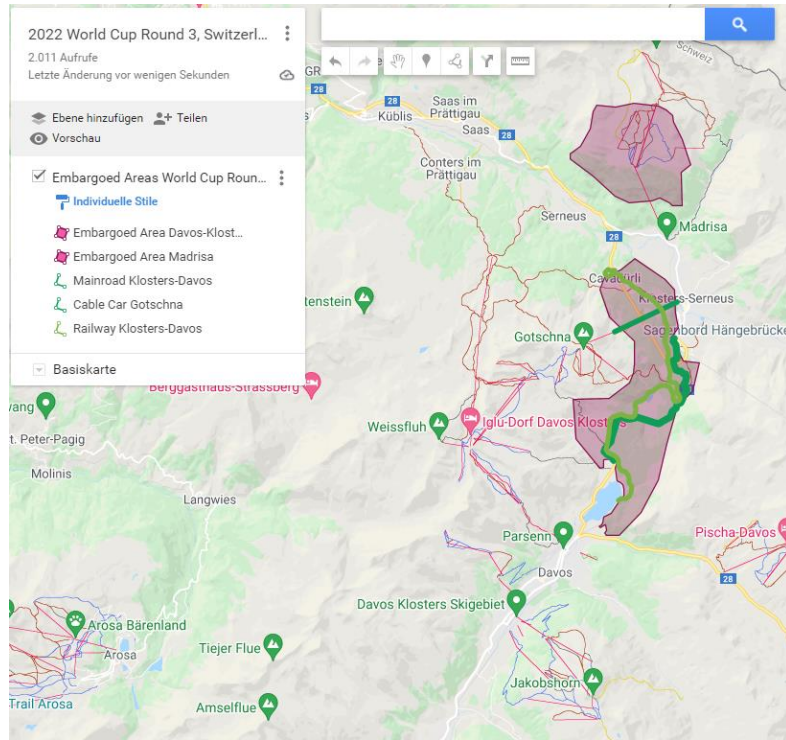
We also have several offers with good prices from hotels in Davos and Klosters. The list is available on Eventor. You may contact the hotels directly for booking.

The entry fee includes the dinner for Saturday at Madrisa just after the race and on Monday evening in conjunction with the World Cup party.

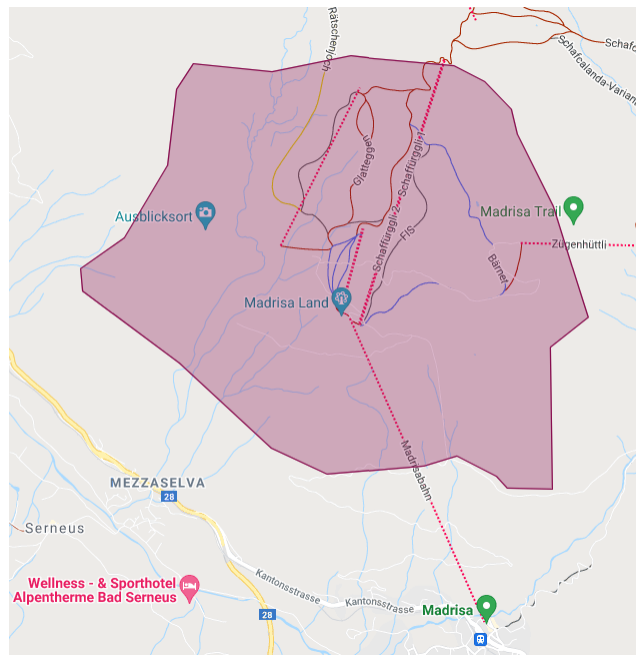
7. EMBARGOED AREAS

The [marked competition areas](#) around Davos and Klosters are embargoed areas. For competitors, team officials and others who, through knowledge of the terrain or the competitions, may influence the results of the competitions, it is prohibited to enter the embargoed areas. It is allowed to pass through the embargoed area on the railway track, the main road Davos-Klosters and the cable car Gotschna.

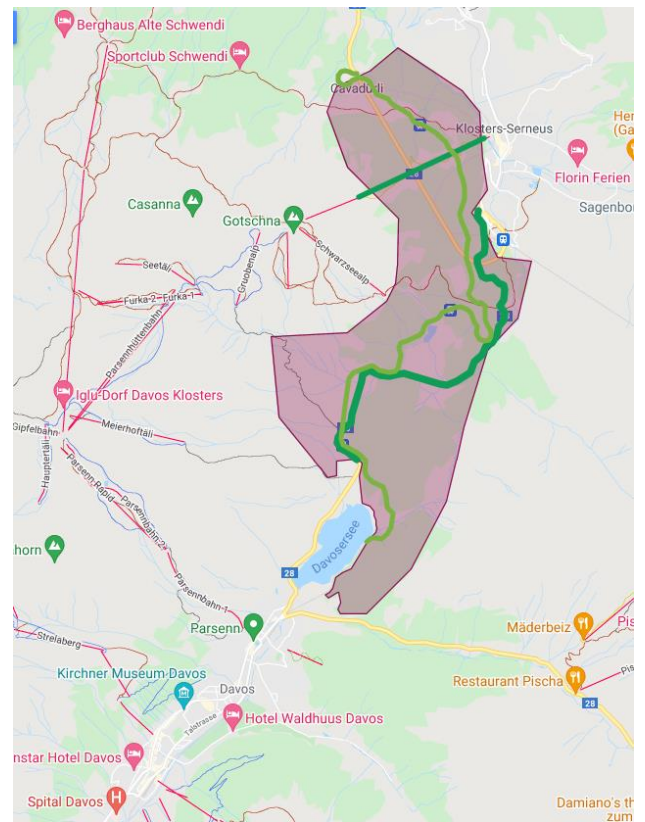
Overview

7.1 PREVIOUS ORIENTEERING MAPS

There are previous orienteering maps from the Davos-Klosters embargo. Madrisa has never been mapped before, an autogenerated map from mapant.ch is available. All documents can be downloaded from Eventor.

8. TRAINING

As September is the hunting season in the region of Graubünden, we will not be able to provide different trainings around Davos Klosters before the event. We will offer one or two training/model maps on Thursday or Friday.

The training map will be given to all entered runners and coaches.

After the Long race on Monday, we will provide WOC-trainings around Davos on Tuesday and Wednesday (4-5 October 2022) as well as trainings around Flims from Thursday to Saturday (6-8 October 2022). This is a perfect possibility to get familiar with the WOC 2023-terrain.

9. RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATIONS

9.1 COMPETITION RULES

The Competition Rules for IOF Foot Orienteering Events 2022, valid from 1 January 2022 and the Special Rules for the 2022 Orienteering World Cup apply.

9.2 CLASSES AND PARTICIPATION RESTRICTIONS

There are two classes, Women and Men.

Participation restrictions, classes and qualification system will follow the Special Rules for the 2022 World Cup in Orienteering.

9.3 ANTI-DOPING

Doping is strictly forbidden, and the organizers of the World Cup are dedicated to supporting the Anti-Doping authorities in their work. Doping controls may be carried out any time during the competitions in accordance with the procedures described in the WADA International Standard of Testing and Investigations. The latest IOF Anti-Doping rules and the World Anti-Doping Code applies. Athletes who are selected for doping control must bring an official identification (with photo) to the doping test area. The athlete should also present the personal therapeutic use exemption (TUE) if applicable. In general, it is advisable that athletes take their ID to all competitions and events. 9.4 INSURANCE

The organizers decline any liability that might occur through participation in World Cup Events 7, 8 and 9 and trainings. Each person participates at her/his own risk and is responsible for her/his own insurance coverage (illness and accident).

9.5 CLIMATE

Average temperatures in Davos in September/October lies between 12 and 0°C in day-time. Be aware that the terrains are up to 2000m above sealevel. Weather can change fast in the mountains, so take appropriate clothes with you.

9.6 COVID-19 MEASURES

Measures to avoid spread of the corona virus may be needed. The applicable state regulations, supplemented by those of the organizers and the IOF, are authoritative and must be observed. More information to come in coming bulletins.

9.7 VISA PERMITS

The prerequisite for immigration into Switzerland is a valid passport. For travelers from certain countries a visa or further documents are required.

11. COMPETITION INFORMATIONS

11.1 PUNCHING SYSTEM

Touchfree SPORTident Air+ punching will be used. Participants are asked to use their own SIAC cards during the event. Please be aware that your correct SIAC-number must be entered in the athlete's profile on Eventor.

The organizer will offer rental SIAC which may be booked in the official entry system IOF Eventor. After successful registration of the team size entry, the option to book a service becomes visible in IOF Eventor.

11.2 CLOTHING

There are no regulations on clothing. Shoes with spikes are not allowed in all races. Dobb-spikes are only allowed in Middle and Long, but not in the relay.

Format	Relay men and women with 3 legs, massstart
Map	Madrisa, 1:10000, 5m by Flavio Poltera
Terrain	Alpine terrain with steep slopes at the tree line at 1700-2000m above sea level.
Forms	Moderate to steep slopes. Detailed contours vary with slopes with poor details.
Vegetation	Alpine, open forest, meadows and grassland.
Runability	Good to very good runability with some undergrowth and few stones.
Course length	30-35' per leg. WE approx. 3.8km/250m, ME approx. 4.6km/280m
Course setters:	Hansjörg Rutz and Beat Flühmann.

12.2 EGK ORIENTEERING WORLD CUP FINAL MIDDLE

Format	Middle distance with 2' start interval
Map	Drusatschawald, 1:10000, 5m by Urs Steiner
Terrain	Alpine terrain with a lot of contour details, stones and cliffs at 1500-1800 m above sea level.
Forms	Hilly to steep with detailed contours.
Vegetation	Alpine, open forest.
Runability	Good to very good runability with some undergrowth and stony parts.
Course length	30-35'. WE approx. 4.2km/240m, ME approx. 5.3km/300m;
Course setters:	Sara and Fabian Hertner.

12.3 EGK ORIENTEERING WORLD CUP FINAL LONG

Format	Long distance with 2' to 4' start interval
Map	Zugwald, 1:15000, 5m by Urs Steiner
Terrain	Alpine terrain with steep slopes varying with a lot of contour details, stones and cliffs at 1500-1900 m above sea level.
Forms	Moderate to steep slopes. Detailed contours vary with slopes with poor details.
Vegetation	Alpine, open forest, meadows and grassland.
Runability	Good to very good runability with some undergrowth and stony parts.
Course length	WE approx. 10.0km/480m, 80', ME approx. 14.5km/650m 90'.
Course setters:	Thomas Egger and Stephan Bernhard.

14. PUBLIC RACES

On Saturday and Sunday, there will be two national competitions as public races to the World Cup. On Monday, an open training is planned for the spectators.

The public races will take part at the same locations and in the same terrains as the EGK Orienteering World Cup Final. So it's really worth coming to Switzerland as a spectator to follow the EGK Orienteering World Cup Final and run in the same terrains.
