



2 Venue and history

The Competition Center is located at the **Biathlon Arena** in **Obertilliach** (GPS 46°42'33"N 12°35'27"E). The distance from Munich International Airport to Obertilliach is approximately 300 km by car. The nearest railway station is in Lienz (40 km by car).



Maybe useful to know Obertilliach (= "Upper" Tilliach, 1.450 m):

The old name of Tilliach "Cercinago" gives reference to the first inhabitants, the Romans. Bavarian settlement of the area is first mentioned in the late 11th century. The present-day municipality was established in 1852.

The high certainty of snow in Obertilliach attracted soon the first cross-country skiers. Joining the "Dolomitenlauf", first held in 1973, many international guests visited Obertilliach. Finally, in the 1980s the biathletes got aware of the high quarantee of snow




and 1989 the first and by now only Biathlon World Cup was held. With the opening of the Biathlon Center in 2004 and the "King of Biathlon" Ole Einar Bjoerndalen taking residence in Obertilliach, the place became a worldwide recognized spot of the Nordic scene. In addition to the annual IBU Cup competitions Obertilliach hosted the Biathlon Junior World Championships in 2013.



Today, Obertilliach is the most important tourist center in Tyrol's Gailtal respectively Lesachtal but also remains a charming Tyrolean mountain village. Traditions and customs are still very much alive and the farmers cultivate the wonderfully cultured landscape. Over 1100 beds for tourists in Obertilliach with its 700 inhabitants underline the importance of tourism. However, a number of the Obertilliach people shuttle day by day to the Pustertal or even to Lienz for their daily work.

The village is still "guarded" by Austria's last night watchman. Twice a week, he walks his tour through the narrow and winding streets of Obertilliach.

All athletes and team officials should be accredited first they come to the Competition Center in the Arena at the Biathlon Center (Obertilliach). They should wear their accreditation card throughout the whole week.



6 Terrain Type

Typical alpine valley with forest, marshes and open fields. The terrain is situated between 1250m and 1400m altitude.



7 Model event

A model event will be available on Sunday February 28th close to the Arena between 10:00 to 16:00. Maps can be collected at the Competition Center during opening hours.

8 Competitions

Snow conditions were very poor until February 14th. Snowfall on February 15th made it much better, but all course parameters below may change due to actual snow conditions.

9 Punching system and competition controls

The SPORTident-ActiveCard "SIAC1" is a combined active/passive transponder card. It works in the classical SPORTident direct punching mode, as well as for contactless punching (range 30 - 60 cm), when the SPORTident AIR+ system configuration is used. In these competitions the SPORTident AIR+ will be used. SIAC contains a battery and will always work in direct punching mode even if the battery is empty. Direct punching provides a fall-back option to register at controls. In contactless punching mode the SIAC's optical and acoustic feedback signals confirm that a control code and timestamp have been successfully written to the card. It is the responsibility of the competitor to check the battery prior entering the pre-start and CLEAR the SIAC when entering. The CHECK-process is mandatory for all SPORTident AIR+ applications. AIR+ functionality is terminated by the FINISH-punch. SIAC will be offered by the organizers. Lost SIAC must be paid by the participants.

Additionally, at every competition control a mechanical system for punches is available. In the model event the control set-up used throughout the competition is demonstrated.






10 Starting scheme

Individual start

Pre start is 4 minutes before start. In all distances athletes receive the map 15 seconds before start. An electronic start line "Air+" will be used to record the exact start time. The competitor may start any time between five seconds before the start signal and the start signal. If a competitor starts late, the start list time is taken as the start time. A competitor who starts more than 5 seconds early and does not restart is disqualified. Competitors must follow the marked route from the time start line to the map start triangle.



Mass start

In relay and middle distance mass starts are planned. At mass start athletes are called to the start area at least 5 minutes prior to start time. Clear and check of SIAC occurs at check-in for own responsibility. Maps are handed out to the athletes between 90 and 45 seconds before the start. Athletes have to keep the map into their hand behind the back until command "MAP" is given 15 seconds before the start. Start "GO" will be given. For the first approximately 50 meters only double pooling is allowed. Competitors must follow the marked route from the time start line to the map start triangle.



11 Start number bibs

Each athlete will receive two adhesive start number bibs to be worn clearly visible on the right and left leg (additional fixing with fixing pins is recommended) for every competition. The number bibs may not be folded or cut. The starting numbers will have a colored bar, for easier identification of competition type:

ESOC	— red bar
JWS0C	— blue bar
EYSOC	— yellow bar

Additionally, number vests will be used for ESOC. These number vests will be handed out the day before competition in the team officials` meeting. The number vests will be collected at the finish.

12 Equipment control and coaching zone

An equipment control and coaching zone will be available in the Arena in all competitions with mass start and long distance. An additional equipment control will be available in the forest in long distance competitions.

13 Refreshments during competition

In Long Distance race organizers will provide drinking during the competition. Detailed information will be provided in the team officials' meeting.

14 Finish

There is no punching needed at the finish line (red line).
The finish time is taken, when the SIAC passes the finish line.

Maximum skiing times are:

Sprint distance45m	in
Middle distance90m	in
Long distance180m	in
Sprint relay120m	
Relay200m	

Maps must be returned after crossing the finish line and will be handed out to the team leaders at team officials meeting.



15 Skitest and warm up area

Ski testing and warm up area is available next to the Arena (for details see map of Arena).

16 Waxing facilities

Teams' waxing facilities at the Arena are available for rent (full cabin for the whole week 150.-€, shared cabin (two teams) for the whole week 75.-€ per team).



17 Flower ceremony and prize giving ceremony

The best three athletes and best three teams in each category will be awarded at the flower ceremony. The flower ceremony will take place directly after the competition in the Arena. The athletes are kindly asked to wear their national team competition uniform.

The best six athletes and best six teams in each category will be awarded at the prize giving ceremony. They should meet at 18:45 at the Conference Center. The prize giving ceremony will take place at the Plaza at 19:00 o`clock on each competition day. The athletes are kindly asked to wear their national team uniform.

18 GPS tracking

GPS tracking devices will be used each competition. The list of competitors, who have to wear the devices, will be available in the team officials` meeting the day before the competition. The GPS tracking devices are available for the selected athletes at the pre start area.

19 Media services and broadcast

The media centre is located at the Arena. The media centre provides media representatives with access to internet. The competition will be broadcasted. Life stream will be available at the IOF life center (http://livecenter.orienteering.org).

20 Fair play

All persons taking part in a ski orienteering event shall behave with fairness and honesty. They shall have a sporting attitude and a spirit of friendship. Competitors shall show respect for each other, for officials, journalists, spectators and the inhabitants of the competition area. The competitors shall be as quiet as possible in the terrain.

Except in the case of an accident, seeking to obtain or obtaining assistance from other competitors or providing assistance to other competitors during a competition is forbidden. It is the duty of all competitors to help injured competitors.

21 Doping controls

Doping is strictly forbidden, and the organizers of the European Ski Orienteering Championships 2016 are dedicated to supporting the Anti-Doping authorities in their work.

Doping controls may be carried out any time during the competition period. For the athletes' comfort and convenience, we suggest that athletes are prepared at all events to take along some dry clothes to change into after their race. Doping tests are always carried out in accordance with the procedures described in the WADA International Standard for Testing. The IOF Anti-Doping Rules apply as of 1st January 2015. Athletes who are selected for the doping tests must bring an official identification (with photo) to the doping test area. The athletes should also bring along their therapeutic use exemption (TUE) if applicable. In general, it is advisable that the athletes bring along their ID to all the competitions and events.



22 Medical aid and insurance

Medical aid will be available in the Arena and also in the competition area (mountain rescue).

Athletes participate in IOF European Ski Orienteering Championships (ESOC), Junior World Ski Orienteering Championships (JWSOC), European Youth Ski Orienteering Championships (EYSOC) and World Cup 2015/16 Round 3 at their own risk. Individuals are responsible for their own insurance cover for illness/accident.

23 Catering at the arena

We offer for all teams catering at the Arena. A delicious lunch with two courses and free soft drinks will be served between 11:00 and 14:30 on each competition day (8,50€/person). Please purchase the voucher for the meals when registering at the Competition Centre.

24 Team officials` meeting

Team officials` meeting will be held throughout the week prior competitions. Team leaders of all federations, IOF representatives and the organizers will meet at the Conference Centre before the price giving ceremonies.

Attendance of all team leaders is requested. Competition material will be handed out based on availability. Any information shared at the team officials´ meeting is prior to earlier published information.



25 Complaints

Any complaints should be made in written form and handed over to the organizer at the competition center. Complaints should be made not later than 15 min after publication of the official result list at the competition center.

26 Jury

The jury will consist of officials from the Czech Republic (CZE), Slovakia (SVK) and Finland (FIN).

27 Opening ceremony

For the opening ceremony at the Plaza of Obertilliach all athletes, team officials` and accompanying persons are kindly invited. All athletes are asked to gather at the meeting point behind the Town Hall at 18:40 (every nation should bring their own flag to the opening ceremony). The opening ceremony will be out door. It will not take longer than forty minutes. If possible, please wear official team uniform at the opening ceremony.

So come and let the event begin. Rock the Snow and Never give up!
