Unfortunately, due to international context and accelerated increase in all prices, new rules for JWOC competition and final rules in sprint relay competition, we must publish the Bulletin 2.1.

The changes refer to the following items:

Baia Mare is located in the northwestern part of Romania (70 km from the border with Hungary and 60 km from the border with Ukraine). It is crossed by the Sasar river and has about 200,000 inhabitants. It was an important mining center, a lot of non-ferrous ore was extracted around the city, but the mines closed one by one, nowadays there are very few mines operating. Baia Mare is known not only for its underground riches but also for the surroundings that give a special beauty to the place. In addition, the city of Baia Mare and Maramures County are famous for the fact that they managed to preserve very well their Romanian traditions and customs.

Baia Mare is also an important cultural center, the city was a finalist in the race to obtain the titles of European Capital of Culture in 2021, as well as the title of European Youth Capital in 2023.

Oradea airport	200 km to event center (Driving distance – 3h)
Budapest airport(HU)	400 km to event center (Driving distance – 4h.30 min)
Bucharest airport	600 km to event center (Driving distance – 8 h)

Baia Mare can be easily reached by car, in the area there is a rich network of roads, but there are no highways.



Spectator races

There will be spectator races connected to JWOC 2023. JWOC O-Tour is the social part of JWOC 2023 and opens for everyone. The races will start immediately after JWOC races and Medal Ceremonies and is a great opportunity to compete in JWOC 2023 terrains. In sprint race the competitors will be entry in natural labyrint.





4. Classes and age restriction

The competition classes are W20 and M20. All competitors must be born in 2003 or after and must be full passport holding citizens of the country they are representing.

5. Terrain and mapping

Sprint

The competition area is at an altitude of 220 meters and is very runnable with very good visibility. There is a high density of buildings, a dense network of asphalt roads but also open ground. The area is flat, with no difference in level.


Sprint areas will be mapped by Ionut Zinca, using the most actual International Specification for Sprint Orienteering Maps.

Forest

Terrain areas are located 600-900 m above se level. The areas has moderate to high climb and few large open area in the forest. The vegetation is complex, from runable terrain to hard-to-cross thickets or fallen trees. There is no aggressive or hanging type vegetation. Runnability and visibility varies a lot from place to place, it varies from very easy to very difficult. Stones and rocks are present, but in moderate quantity. The land has some portions with microrelief but also very steep valleys. Path network is moderate.

Forest areas will be mapped by Liviu Tintar, using Lidar Technologies and the most actual International Specification for Orienteering Maps.

6. Embargoed areas

The embargoed areas are completely forbidden to visit by competitors, team officials and other persons who, throught knowledge of the terrain, may influence the competition's results.

Important!

Starting with the JWOC 2023 edition, the qualifications for the middle distance race have been eliminated, all competitors will participate directly in the final. There will be a sprint relay race, the prologue edition in this race was in JWOC 2022 – Portugal. After the final discusses with IOF officials and team officials in Portugal, the final decision is: each country has the right to align at the start 2 teams of 2 girls and 2 boys and the order in the relays is W-M-M-W.

8. Punching system

SPORTIdent Air+ system (SIAC) will be used to JWOC 2023 and JWOC O-Tour.

9. Competition clothing

There are no special regulation to runners applying to runners concerning the type of clothing they choose to wear. The organisers recommend to use of long trousers for the forest zones, because there are present many types of green areas, but that are not "aggressive" green type.

It is forbidden to use shoes with spikes in the sprint competitions.

10. Maximum numbers per team

Each Federation may enter a team of up to 12 competitors: 6 women, 6 men and 4 team officials, maximum total 16 persons.

Every athlete and team leader needs to set up a profile with passport-style photo. Each nation must provide a contact person and address that JWOC organizers can communicate with.

Preliminary entries (team size entries) can be submitted from 10 April 2023. **Deadline for preliminary entries (team size entries):** 10 May 2023.

Final Entries: (team names entries) can be submitted from 11 May 2023.

Deadline for final entries (team names entries): name of competitors and team officials must be entered in IOF Eventor no later than 20 June 2023.

14. Transport

All official transport will depart from and return to this places:

- Event center
- A category accommodation
- B category accommodation
- C category accommodation

No transport will be provided to the opening ceremonies and sprint relay, since all will be held in Event Center's neighborhood.

The use of **official transport is mandatory** in the following situations:

- To travel from Event Center and A, B and C category accommodation to the quarantine area on the sprint, middle distance and long distance
- To travel from quarantine areas to arena

The use of **official transport is not mandatory** in the following situations:

- To travel from Event Center and A, B and C category accommodation to the official training areas
- To travel from Event Center and A, B and C category accommodation to the sprint relay arena and relay arena
- To return from the arenas back to accommodation places
- To travel directly to the arena for all officials

In this cases official transport is not mandatory, but is recommended, because the arenas parking is limited and long walks from parking to arenas may occur.

All transport will be covered by accreditation entry fee.

15. Competition centre

Competition centre is situated in the city center of Baia Mare at the "Petre Dulfu" municipal library, GPS coordinates: 47.658929, 23.569240



Opening and Closing Ceremony and all Award Ceremonies will be organized in the Event Centre's neighborhood.



In case of bad weather the ceremonies will be held in the "Lascar Pana" Sports Hall with 2.000 seats, 1.000 m from the Competition Centre.

20. CLIMATE

The climate of Baia Mare is continental, with cold winters and warm summers. July is warm and sunny, though thunderstorms can break out in the afternoon. The minimum average temperature is around 14 °C and the maximum average is 26 °C. There can be very hot periods, in which the temperature reach or exceed 33 °C.

The organizers will reinforce refreshment controls on all forest stages.
