

Competition Classes for Sprint & Middle-Distance Events

Classes	Age of Competitor
W16 & M16	Up to 16 years old, born in 2008 or after
W18 & M18	Up to 18 years old, born in 2006 or after
W20 & M20	Up to 20 years old, born in 2004 or after
W21 & M21E	No Age Limit

Additional competition classes that cater for the younger and senior runners may be announced later.

Relay orienteering is a competition for teams of three runners running on a virtually head-to-head basis with a first-past-the-post winner. Exciting for spectators and competitors.

- 1. Minimum age of participation is age 13, born in or 2011.
- 2. In each class, each Federation may enter a maximum of 10 men and 10 women in the M/W21E class and a maximum of 6 men and 6 women in M/W16, M/W18, M/W20 class.
- 3. The relay is a middle-distance event, and each team shall contain 3 leg runners.

 In each relay class, each Federation may enter 2 teams in each class but only the better-placed team will be counted in the prize list.
- 4. Competitors must represent member Federations of the IOF and as defined by the International Olympic Committee as belonging to the Asian continent, can compete in AsOC & AsJYOC.
- 5. Competitors representing other member Federations of IOF or other Asian countries can participate in AsOC & AsJYOC as Open class but will not be eligible for the AsOC & AsJYOC titles, medals or diplomas.
- 6. The winners of the M/W21 class will be the Asian Champions of the AsOC. The winners of the M/W 20 class will be Asian Junior Champions of the AsJYOC and M/W18 and M/W16 will be the Asian Youth Champions respectively.



Terrain description & Competition maps information

Sprint - 22 December 2024 (Sunday)

Scale: 1:4000, 2.5m contour interval,

Sprint: The park is approximately 600m north/south and 700m east/west and is made for the 2006 World Horticultural exhibition. The park consists of network of garden paths, artificial ponds, and small hills, with buildings, small sculptures, maze like constructions, and shrubs.

It has a variety of different buildings and pathways. The running surfaces are primarily paved streets and grass which requires runners to read the map while in high-speed running. The height difference of the competition area is about 30 meters.



Middle: Gentry undulating hills, whose height difference is 60m, consists of several shallow hill tops, many complex re-entrants, and relatively wide valleys whose bottom are flat. The area is covered by plantation of teak trees with some undergrowth. Visibility is relatively not high but mostly runnable. There are very few man-made objects in the forest. Tracks are few and the dense vegetation includes indistinct paths.





Punching System

The Sportident AIR+ punching system will be used in all competitions. All cards will be provided for competitors for the duration of the competition. Lost or damaged cards will be chargeable to the federation.

Clothing

There are no clothing restrictions for Sprint Events. However, for the middle and middle relay, competitors must wear clothing that fully cover their legs.

Shoes with studs / spikes are not permitted for sprint events. For middle and middle relay, the choice of footwear is free.

Organizers may mandate on the addition of a whistle for middle and middle relay. (See Bulletin 1)

Competition Rules

IOF Competition Rules for Foot Orienteering (including appendix for AsOC and AsJYOC) will apply.

Model Event

There will be a model event held on 21st December 2024 for both the Middle and Sprint distances. The chosen location will be alike to the actual competition ground. Technical model will also be held at the same place. Transportation will be catered for all participants.

Training Opportunity

TOF will be organizing an ASEAN O-league on 14-15 September 2024 in Chiang Mai city. There will be a WRE Sprint and WRE Middle on that weekend. The location of these two races will be alike to the AsOC / AsJYOC.
