




Central Edinburgh is embargoed. Athletes and team officials may only use permitted routes to pass through the embargoed area. The permitted routes will change from 1 July 2024. Further information is in the 'Embargoed Areas' section on page 9 and at IOF Eventor.



LOCATION



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GETTING HERE

Edinburgh has great transport links to Europe and the rest of the World.

Rail: Waverley station in the city centre is served by direct trains (4.5hrs) run by <u>LNER</u> and <u>Lumo</u> from London Kings Cross, which is adjacent to the <u>Eurostar</u> terminal at London St Pancras.

Ferry: There is no direct ferry between Scotland and Europe, but <u>DFDS</u> has a daily sailing from Amsterdam to Newcastle, which is 90 minutes from Edinburgh by train.

Air: Edinburgh Airport (EDI), which is approximately 12km west of the city centre, has direct flights to many European cities. There are good public transport links from the airport to the city centre with Edinburgh Trams and Lothian Buses.

VISAS

Citizens of some countries must obtain a visa in order to enter the UK. Potential WOC 2024 participants are advised to keep up to date with the current regulations. Check if you need a UK visa on <u>gov.uk</u>.

INSURANCE

Each person participates in activities and competitions associated with WOC 2024 at their own risk, and each person is responsible for their own insurance coverage.

CLIMATE

Edinburgh's summer climate is mild and damp, with a daily mean temperature of 15°C and 5.5 hours of sunshine. Average monthly precipitation is 72mm, with >1mm falling on 11 days per month. Sunrise in mid-July is at approximately 04:45 BST and sunset at approximately 21:45 BST.

GETTING ABOUT

The Event Centre and all our venues are served by Edinburgh's excellent public transport system. This is usually the fastest and most reliable way of moving around Edinburgh, especially in the city centre during the busy summer tourism season.

For route maps, journey planners and fare details, see <u>Lothian Buses</u> and <u>Edinburgh Trams</u>.

All accredited athletes and team officials will be provided at accreditation with a pass that allows them 20 free single journeys by public transport within Edinburgh. This pass can be used for journeys on Lothian Buses and Edinburgh Trams within the city (including to all race venues), but is not valid for journeys to/from Edinburgh Airport. The pass will be valid until 21 July.

There will be no car parking for athletes or team officials at any venue or at the Event Centre. **See the 'Race Details' section on page 15 for information about transport to race venues**, including mandatory transport for all athletes and team officials who are going to quarantine.

RULES & PREVIOUS MAPS

The 2024 World Orienteering Championships will be run under the 2024 Competition Rules for IOF Foot Orienteering Events.

All athletes represent a Federation and must be citizens of the country of that Federation. All athletes must have an <u>IOF athlete licence</u> to participate at WOC 2024. There are no age restrictions.

In the Sprint and Knock-out Sprint competitions, there is one class for women and one for men. The classes are called Women and Men. A Federation may enter up to three women and up to three men in each competition.

Additional personal starting spots are allocated to reigning World and Regional Champions in the Sprint and Knock-out Sprint competitions, if they are selected by their Federation. The IOF has published the list of personal places in the <u>National Quota for Foot-O</u> document.

In the Sprint Relay, each Federation may enter one team consisting of four team members, of whom at least two must be women.

The IOF Foot-O referee system will be used for all races.

PREVIOUS MAPS

Previous maps of competition areas (where available) are available in OCAD and PDF formats from the Technical Director. For details, see the WOC 2024 website.

Routegadget from previous events and information on public access mapping data are also available on the <u>WOC 2024 website</u>.

EMBARGOED AREAS

Several areas in and around Edinburgh have been embargoed for WOC 2024. Up-to-date information on the embargo rules, the areas under embargo, permitted routes, and permitted areas for studying is available at <u>IOF Eventor</u>.

Embargoed areas and permitted routes and areas may change at short notice. Potential WOC athletes and other interested parties should always check IOF Eventor for the most up-to-date information. All queries regarding embargoed areas should be sent to the Technical Director at <u>technicaldirector@woc2024.org</u>.

A stricter embargo will come into effect for Central Edinburgh **from 1 July 2024**, with the withdrawal of all permitted areas for studying and most permitted routes. The following permitted routes will remain open:

- » The railway to/from Waverley station
- » The A7 (North Bridge/South Bridge/Clerk Street) between Waverley station and the junction with East Preston Street

Athletes or team officials who wish to take the bus between Waverley station and the Event Centre at Pollock Halls must use bus #30 or #33.

A revised embargo area for Central Edinburgh will be published after the Sprint Finals on 12 July. This will allow athletes and team officials to compete in the Historic Edinburgh WOC Tour race on 15 July.

The embargoes for Leith, Wester Hailes and Riccarton Campus will not change. King's Buildings is embargoed as a reserve area and may be released on 1 July 2024 if no longer required.



ENTRIES

Entry opened on 1 April 2024. Entries can only be made in IOF Eventor. If you have any queries, contact <u>entries@woc2024.org</u>.

- » The deadline for Team Size Entry is 12 May 2024
- » The deadline for Team Names Entry is 2 July 2024
- » The deadline for Late Entries, changes of Team Size, or changes of Team Names is 12:00 BST (midday) on 11 July

At Team Size Entry, you must provide the following information:

- » Name of Team Manager (chosen from a list in IOF Eventor), including email address and mobile phone number
- » Number of team officials
- » Total number of male athletes and total number of female athletes in the team
- » Number of male athletes and number of female athletes you are entering in each individual competition
- » Whether you are entering a team for the Sprint Relay


There is no maximum number of officials per team.

- At Team Names Entry, you must provide the following information:
- » The name of each athlete in the team, by selecting from the Federation members within IOF Eventor
- » SPORTident ActiveCard (SIAC) numbers for each athlete

Late Entries, changes of Team Size or Team Names

- » Changes after the relevant deadline will be subject to a 10% additional charge
- » Changes must be communicated directly to the organiser via wocoffice@woc2024.org
- » The organiser will make the changes in IOF Eventor
- » No changes will be accepted after 12:00 BST (midday) on 11 July

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ACCREDITATION

Accreditation will take place at the WOC Event Office during published opening hours.

A personal WOC 2024 ID card with photo will be issued at accreditation. All accredited persons must wear this card at all relevant times, and it must be presented in order to access all means of transport and authorised zones. All persons to be accredited must provide a personal portrait photo for use on the ID card via the online entry or registration form on IOF Eventor.

ATHLETES AND TEAM OFFICIALS

Each registered team member must present their personal passport at accreditation. Team Managers must be present at accreditation in case there are any issues about citizenship, IOF licence etc. that need clarification.

The accreditation fee includes: city-wide transport pass, Model Events, mandatory transport between Event Centre and race venues, race maps.

For teams where the function of the Team Manager is performed by an athlete there will be no additional accreditation charge.

Participation in WOC events is only possible if all payments are made in full by 12:00 BST (midday) on 11 July 2024.

VIPs, IOF FAMILY AND IOF GUESTS

VIP accreditation is by invitation only. All other IOF Family and IOF Guest registrations must be made via IOF Eventor. Please select the correct category and role.

IOF Family and IOF Guest registration opened on 1 April 2024. The deadline for registration and payment is 15 June 2024. Registration is not valid unless payment has been made. Payments after 15 June will have a 50% additional charge.

MEDIA

There is no charge for media services but **all media personnel must apply for accreditation via IOF Eventor by 15 June 2024**. Accreditation is only valid after confirmation of acceptance by the WOC 2024 Media Operations Manager. A WOC 2024 ID card will be issued at accreditation and must be worn at all times at the race venues.

ACCOMMODATION

POLLOCK HALLS

We recommend that athletes and team officials stay at the Event Centre at Pollock Halls of Residence. Teams are free to arrange their own accommodation elsewhere. However, many hotels are within the embargoed areas. It is the responsibility of every athlete to ensure that they comply with the embargoes.

Pollock Halls of Residence are part of the University of Edinburgh. During the summer vacation there are over 2,000 rooms available, including standard single, double and twin en-suite rooms.

The <u>University of Edinburgh Hospitality and Events Collection</u> has accommodation at Pollock Halls available for booking from Thursday 11 July to Wednesday 17 July 2024. Extended stays may be available on request.

National teams had priority for bookings until March 2024, but this priority period has now expired. Teams who would still like to stay at Pollock Halls should book as soon as possible.

Teams must make their own bookings directly with the University Hospitality and Events Collection.

To start the booking process, contact <u>wocoffice@woc2024.org</u> who will provide contact details for the University Hospitality and Events Collection and give you a booking code to use. Each team must complete a customer creation form before a provisional booking can be made and booking contract sent out for signing. The signed booking contract must be returned within 14 days to confirm the booking, otherwise the accommodation will be released for resale. Payment is required 30 days prior to arrival.

Groups that require lunch and/or dinner can discuss preferential rates based on numbers.

MEDIA SERVICES

Accredited media personnel will have access to a Media Centre at or near each final arena. Services for media will include:

- » Facilities for working, including wireless internet access (fair usage policies apply)
- » Displays showing the broadcast/arena TV production
- » Race maps
- » Start lists and results
- » Coffee and tea
- » Managed access to the photo and media zones
- » Managed access to the mixed zone

There will be no car parking for media at race arenas. We are asking everyone to use public transport to get about within Edinburgh. Please see the 'Getting About' section on page 9.

Media accreditation is free but all media personnel must be accredited. The process for media accreditation opened on 1 April 2024. Please see the 'Accreditation' section on page 12.

ANTI-DOPING

Doping is strictly forbidden. The organisers of WOC 2024 are committed to supporting the anti-doping authorities in their work. Doping controls may be carried out any time during the competition period in accordance with the procedures described in the WADA International Standard for Testing and Investigations.

The <u>IOF Anti-Doping Rules</u> and the <u>World Anti-Doping Code 2021</u> apply as of 1 January 2021.

MEDICAL SERVICES

Athlete medical services will be provided at the race arenas.

Outside of races:

- » to contact the emergency services (Police, Ambulance, Fire, Coastguard) in a life-threatening situation, dial 999
- » for an urgent medical problem that is not a life-threatening emergency, dial 111

RACE DETAILS

All event information on this and the following pages is provisional. In particular, all GPS coordinates are subject to confirmation, and all course information is approximate and subject to final controlling. The distances given from the Event Centre to race arenas are by road.

TRANSPORT

There will be no car parking for athletes or team officials at any race venue.

For athletes and team officials who are going to quarantine, mandatory transport from the Event Centre at Pollock Halls will be provided by the organisers. All athletes and team officials who are going to quarantine must use this transport.

Optional transport from the Event Centre to each race arena will be provided by the organisers for any accredited athletes and team officials who are not going to quarantine.

Optional transport from each race arena back to the Event Centre will be provided by the organisers for all accredited athletes and team officials.



TEAM TENTS

Team tents are not allowed in the pre-start zones, in the quarantine areas or in the team zone at the finish.

CLOTHING

Shoes with spikes or metal dobbs are not allowed. There are no other clothing regulations.

PUNCHING AND TIMING SYSTEM

SPORTident Air+ punching will be used for all races.

For sustainability reasons, athletes should use their own SPORTident ActiveCard (SIAC) during the event. Athlete SIAC numbers must be provided in Eventor at Team Names Entry. Athletes who cannot provide their own SIAC can hire a SIAC from the organiser.

One SIAC will be loaned to each athlete free of charge as a backup in case their own SIAC fails during a race.

GPS

GPS tracking will be provided by Loggator and will be shown live online, on the large screens at the arena, and as part of the TV broadcast.

All athletes in all races must be prepared to carry a GPS tracker. The device will be carried on the back of the athlete in an elastic harness. For hygiene and sustainability reasons, all athletes should bring their own harness. The size of the GPS units is 69mm x 39mm x 24mm, and the weight is 66g.

MODEL EVENT

On 11 July, there will be a Technical Model Event (at the Event Centre, Pollock Halls) and a Model Event (venue to be confirmed). Both events will act as models for all WOC competitions. Maps for the Technical Model Event and Model Event will be supplied at accreditation.

ARTIFICIAL BARRIERS & OUT-OF-BOUNDS AREAS

Artificial barriers may be used in races. Where metal fences are used as artificial barriers, they will (subject to IOF approval) be marked on the map using ISSprOM 709 'Out-of-bounds area' with a 0.5mm solid boundary line, and will always be marked in the terrain with IOF tape.

Boundaries which are mapped using a passable symbol but which must not be crossed on the courses will be marked on the map using 708 'Out-of-bounds boundary' and will always be marked in the terrain with continuous IOF tape.

Outdoor seating areas for restaurants and cafés will be marked on the map with 714 'Temporary construction or closed area'.

Out-of-bounds areas and uncrossable line features that are difficult to recognize on the map or distinguish in the terrain may be marked with continuous IOF tape.

Bulletin 4 will contain full details of how out-of-bounds areas, uncrossable features and artificial barriers will be mapped, and include images of the metal barriers and IOF tape that will be used. Examples of artificial barriers and IOF tape will be displayed at the Model Event.



