1. No minimum age of participation.
2. In each class, each Federation may enter a maximum of 10 men and 10 women in the M/W21E class and a maximum of 6 men and 6 women in M/W16, M/W18, M/W20 class.
3. The relay is a middle-distance event, and each team shall contain 3 leg runners. In each relay class, each Federation may enter 2 teams in each class but only the better-placed team will be counted in the prize list.
4. Competitors must represent member Federations of the IOF and as defined by the International Olympic Committee as belonging to the Asian continent, can compete in AsOC & AsJYOC.
5. Competitors representing other member Federations of IOF or other Asian countries can participate in AsOC & AsJYOC as Open class but will not be eligible for the AsOC & AsJYOC titles, medals or diplomas.
6. The winners of the M/W21E class will be the Asian Champions of the AsOC. The winners of the M/W20 class will be Asian Junior Champions of the AsJYOC and M/W18 and M/W16 will be the Asian Youth Champions respectively.

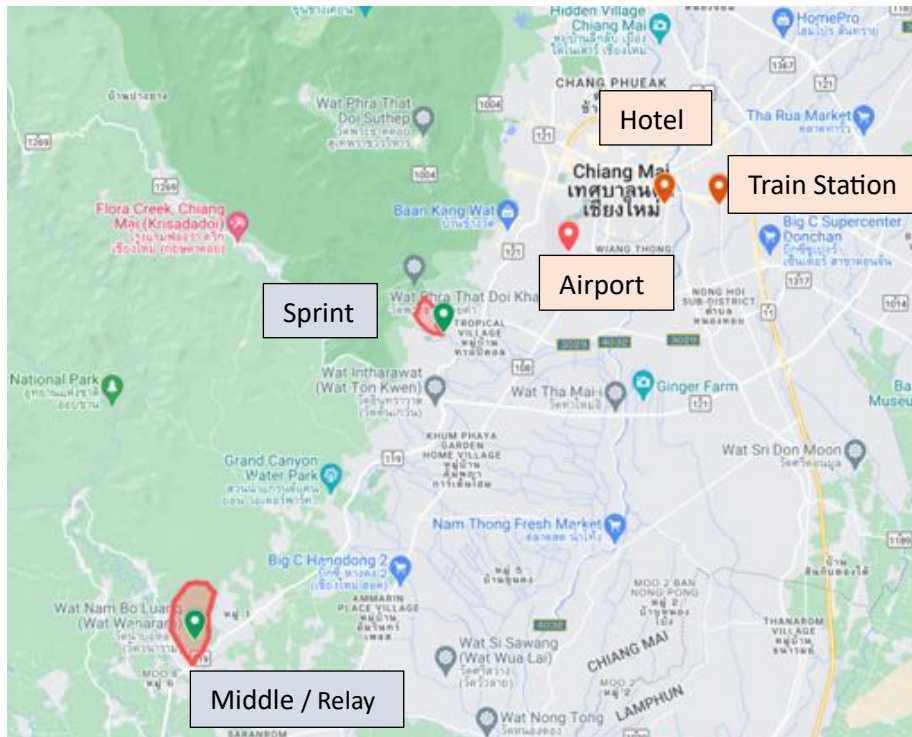

Start Group Preferences – For the sprint and middle races, all athletes should be assigned to three starting groups (1 – Early, 2–Middle and 3–Late). Each federation must allocate its competitors as evenly as possible across the starting group.

Venue Description:

Sprint: The park is approximately 600m north/south and 700m east/west and is made for the 2006 World Horticultural exhibition. The park consists of network of garden paths, artificial ponds, small hills, buildings, small sculptures, maze like constructions, and shrubs.

It has a good variety of different buildings with multi level and pathways. The running surfaces are primarily paved streets and grass which requires runners to read the map while in high-speed running. The height difference of the competition area is about 30 meters.

First aid station is available at the finish.

It is also worthy to note that several surfaces may be slippery from gardening in the area and the operation of a park tourist tram / golf vehicles which will be moving around at a slow pace.

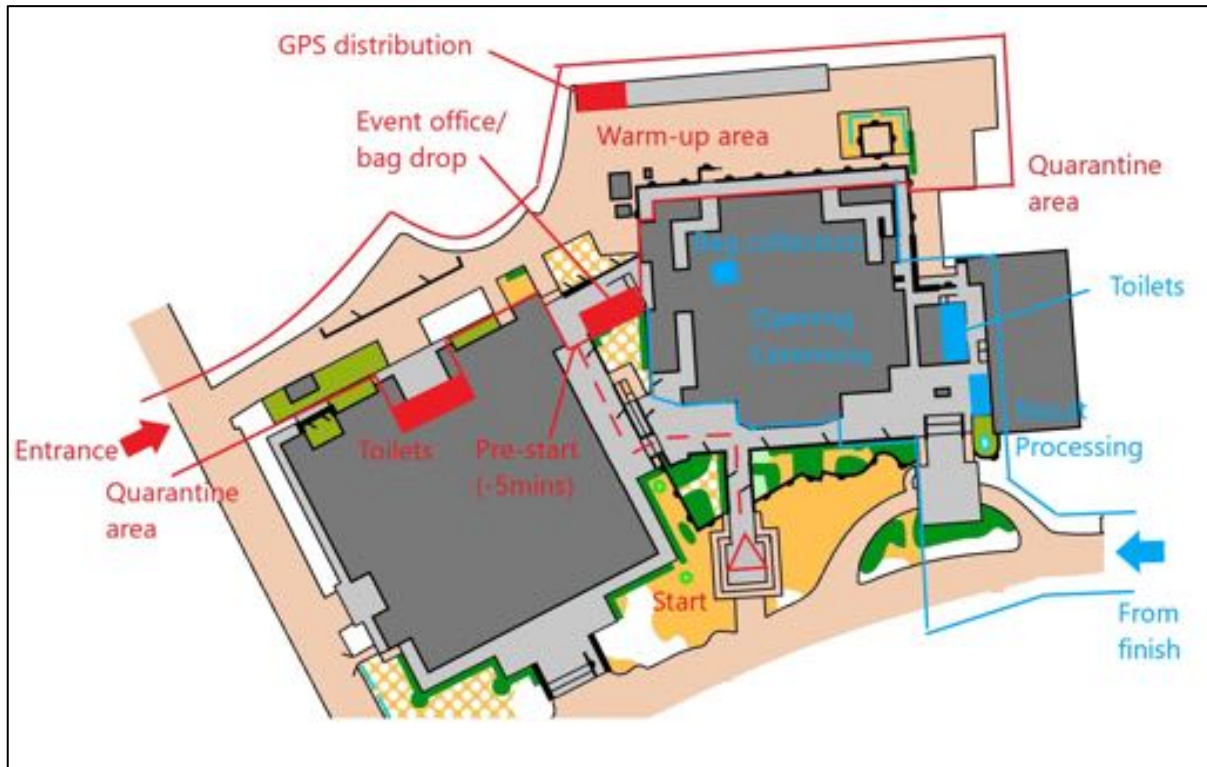

Middle Event: The terrain is made up of gentle undulating hills, whose height difference is about 60m, consisting of several shallow hill tops, many complex re-entrants, and relatively wide valleys whose bottom are flat. Most part of the forest is runnable with some undergrowth; visibility is relatively high and multiple tracks observed in the area. Man-made features are scarce in this forest and participants should be careful not to venture too far off course.

Venturing into dense vegetation also increases the risk of contact with wildlife and participants should be mindful of their surroundings when doing so. There are, however, several sightings of wild dogs in the area and participants are reminded to avoid direct contact with them where possible. The organizing committee will do its best to work with local communities to manage the issue and ensure safety of all participants.

First aid station is available in the terrain, marked with a **+** on the map.

Technical Information:

Due to seasonal change, there are several small paths in the terrain are not marked to maintain clarity.

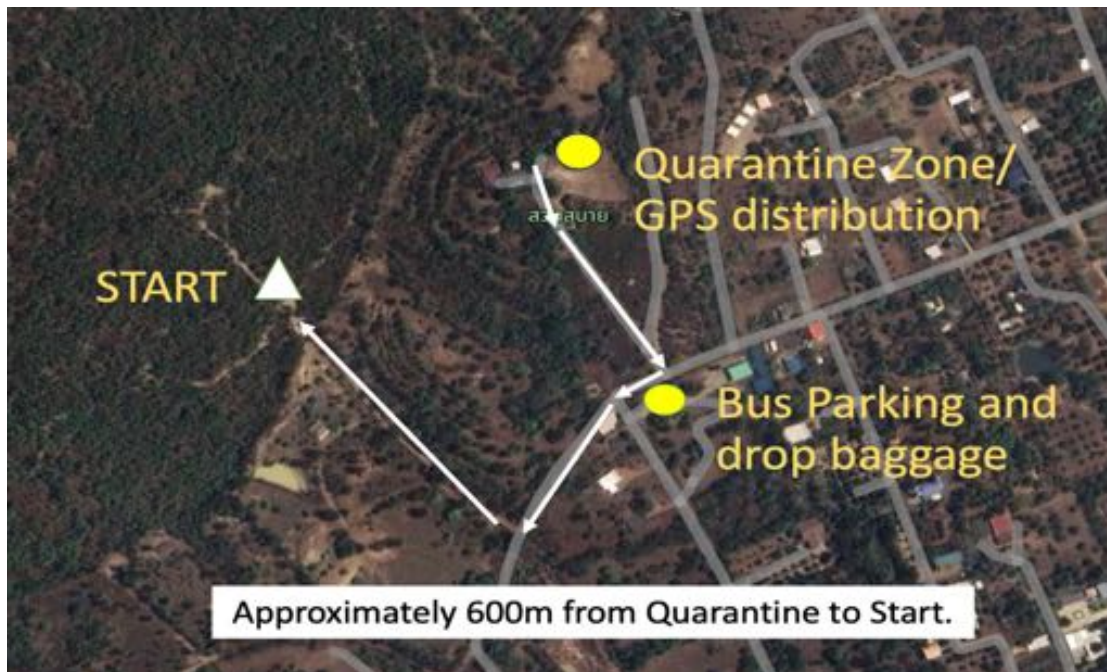
There are numerous erosion gullies in the terrain and the following standards are adopted:

108 Small erosion gullies – are used to describe gullies with a minimum depth of 50cm

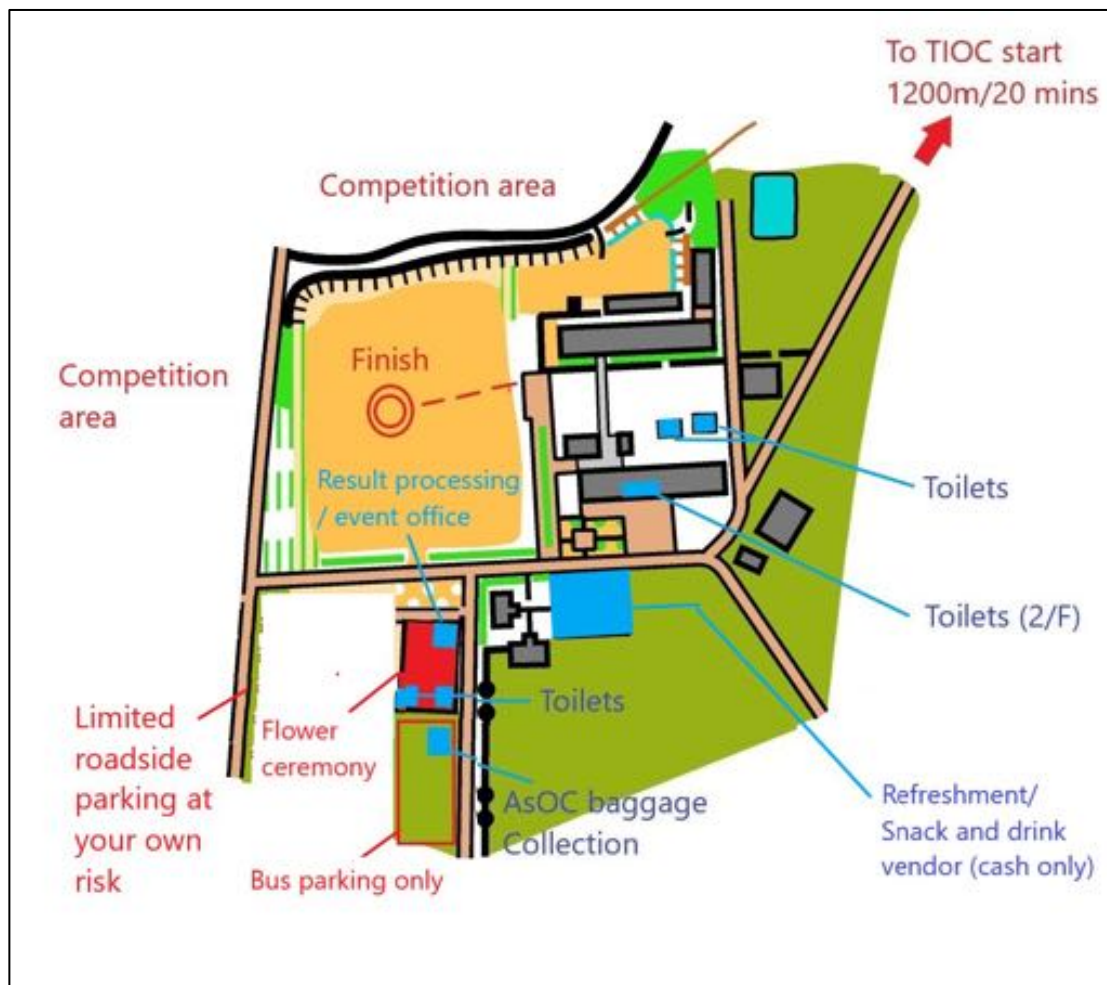
109 Small knolls – are used for knolls with a minimum height of 1.5m and 3m in diameter.

Special symbol (small brown dot 0.6mm instead of the usual 0.75mm) – that are used to describe a mud knoll that is height of 1–1.5m / less than 3m in diameter.

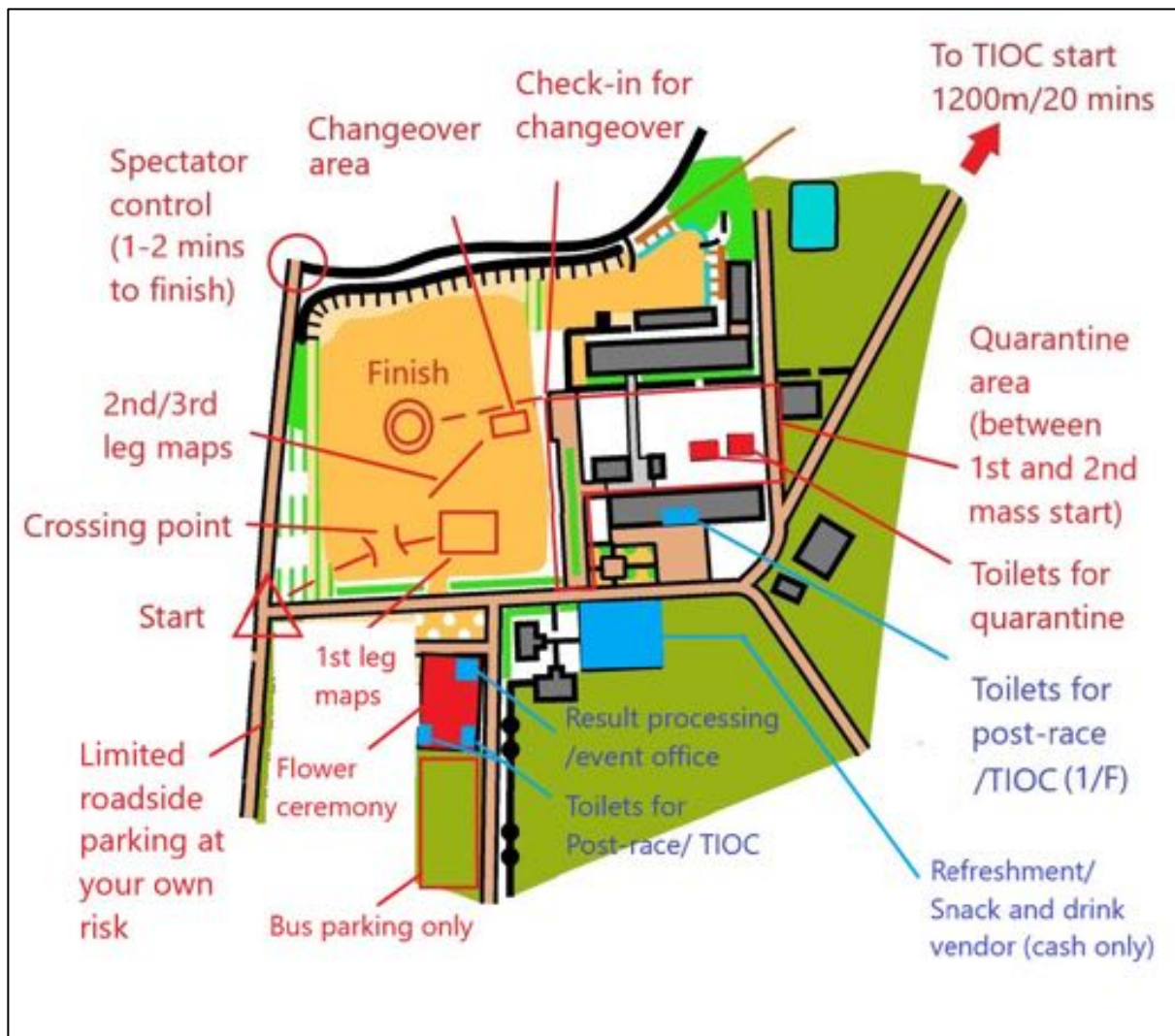
Middle Relay (AsOC) / Middle (TIOC): The terrain will share the same forested ground as the middle event on 23 December. However, the area used for the AsOC relay event will be skewed toward increasing runnability and flatter terrain conditions. The map area will feature a part of a residential built-up area and participants are advised to maintain close map contact as they transit from the forest to urban conditions.

Venturing into dense vegetation also increases the risk of contact with wildlife and participants should be mindful of their surroundings when doing so. There are, however, several sightings of wild dogs in the area and participants are reminded to avoid direct contact with them where possible. The organizing committee will do its best to work with local communities to manage the issue and ensure safety of all participants.

First aid station is available in the terrain, marked with + on the map.

Layout of Arena













Additional Information for Relay:

- 1st leg competitors should head to the mass start area 10 minutes before their start time. A member of staff will hand the maps to them and all competitors will use their feet to step onto the map facedown on the ground.
- Cue to start (1st runner) will be given by an airhorn. Teams who false start will be disqualified.
- The spectator control is located at the northwestern side of the football field. It is the responsibility of the next leg runners to pay attention to the previous leg runner as no announcement will be made.
- 2nd and 3rd competitors should pass through the entrance of the Change-Over Area. Once they went into the changeover area it is not allowed to leave.
- When the previous leg competitor enter the Change-Over Area, he/she should clap hands with his/her teammate, the next leg competitor will then proceed to collect his/her own map, where the maps are attached by a cloth peg on a rope with team number indicated on the back of the map and then continue to proceed to the start triangle.
- The previous leg competitor should punch the finish unit after changeover.
- It is the competitors' responsibility to ensure they are given the map with correct competition number.

2nd Mass Start – All remaining competitors who are not able to change over by 1020am will be asked to gather. They may continue to proceed with normal change over procedures until the last second of 10:29am. At 10:30am, all remaining members will be flagged off in a 2nd Mass Start.

GPS Tracking



A live GPS tracking device will be provided during the event. The company responsible for this is Hui Chang Co (China). The devices may be picked up on each day of the competition before they start off. All devices must be returned to timing service on site after each race. The device will come with accompanying waist pouch and is approximately 70x34x20mm in size. Lost or damaged devices will be charged to the federation.

Model Event

There will be a model event held on 21 December 2024 for both the Middle and Sprint distances. The chosen location was previously used for a WRE in September 2024 and is chosen because of its similarity to the actual competition ground. Technical model will also be held at the same place at the sprint model venue. Transportation will be catered for participants with official transportation package.

Lunch arrangements for the day will be organized by the teams and it is suggested that teams prepare packed lunches or having lunch at a restaurant near the sprint model venue.

Accreditation

Passports for all athletes shall be produced on arrival. The organizer reserves the right to deny entry for athletes until their passport has been inspected.

The venue for accreditation and registration will be located at the hotel lobby. Only team managers and/or officials will be the person responsible for this process.

Teams and officials must produce their accreditation passes to gain access to transportation and event arena.

Teams should also bring 3 national flags, 72cm x 48cm size for prize presentation.

Airport Pick up



Pre-arranged Airport pick up will only be provided to the teams who have sent in their flight arrival requests beforehand. The pick up location will be at Chiang Mai International Airport near Door 7.
