Travel options

Getting to Veszprém from major Airports:

FROM BUDAPEST AIRPORT

145 km // Approximately 1 hour 40 minutes by car, or around 2.5 hours by public transport

FROM VIENNA AIRPORT

180 km // Approximately 2 hours 20 minutes by car, or around 4 hours by public transport

FROM BRATISLAVA AIRPORT

175 km // Approximately 2 hours 20 minutes by car, or around 4.5 hours by public transport

Hungary boasts a first-class transport network, with Veszprém easily accessible by bus and car via the M7 Motorway and main road No. 8, as well as by train.

Scheduled buses and trains from Budapest to Veszprém run approximately every hour. However, the competition venues are most conveniently reached by cars or team buses.

Venues, access and transport

Veszprém – Host City of WOC 2027

Veszprém is one of the most beautiful and captivating small cities in Hungary — and indeed in Europe — with over a thousand years of history, culture, and tradition. Its rich heritage and vibrant artistic scene, still thriving today, made it a natural choice as the European Capital of Culture in 2023.

Veszprém is a compact, peaceful, charming city, inviting you to explore its natural beauty, tranquil parks, and the winding, cobbled streets of its historic old town and castle.

Just beyond the city, the Bakony Hills offer scenic hiking trails, while the nearby Balaton Highlands are home to historic vineyards and picturesque landscapes. And only a short drive away lies Lake Balaton — the largest lake in Central Europe — famed for its beaches, summer festivals, culinary delights, and endless opportunities for relaxation and fun.

The university is located in the centre of Veszprém, just a 5-minute walk from the city's historic center.







Competition Rules

The 2027 edition of the Competition Rules for IOF Foot Orienteering Events will apply to the 2027 World Orienteering Championships and will be available later on the IOF website: https://orienteering.sport/orienteering/competition-rules.

Classes and participation restrictions

- (5.7) There is one class for women and one for men. There are no age restrictions. The classes are called WOMEN and MEN.
- (6.1) A competitor may represent only one Federation at any one time, and must be a citizen of the country of that Federation.
- (6.2) Requests for change of Federation representation will be checked by the IOF Office and will come into effect on 15th April or 15th November. A competitor may not change their Federation representation more frequently than once every four years.

Visa permits

According to current regulations, citizens of certain countries are required to obtain a visa to enter the European Union. EU nationals do not require a visa to enter Hungary. Other travelers may need a Hungarian visa depending on their nationality. For details on visa exemptions and entry requirements, visit the Hungarian Ministry of Foreign Affairs website: konzinfo.mfa.gov.hu/en.

Anti-doping

Doping is strictly forbidden, and the organizers of WOC 2027 are dedicated to supporting the Anti-Doping authorities in their work. Doping controls may be carried out any time during the event in accordance with the procedures described in the WADA International Standard of Testing and Investigations.

Climate

August is peak summer in Hungary, with warm, sunny days and mild nights—ideal for tourism, hiking, and water sports. Veszprém, located at around 260 meters above sea level near Lake Balaton, experiences slightly milder summers ($26-29^{\circ}$ C highs, $14-17^{\circ}$ C lows), and the generally stable weather makes summer a popular time for tourism, festivals, and outdoor activities. Lake Balaton, Central Europe's largest lake and Hungary's top summer destination, offers a pleasant microclimate with average highs of $27-30^{\circ}$ C and warm water temperatures around $24-27^{\circ}$ C — pleasantly warm for swimming and relaxation.
