1. Composition of teams and conditions of entry (see also bulletin 1)

- 1.1. School teams must provide a document certifying that each student of the team has been enrolled at that school from the beginning of the school year.
- 1.2. Where a country is represented by only one team, its delegation may comprise up to 7 persons (and eventually 2 additional persons). A full delegation will comprise 50 persons (and eventually 2 additional persons).
- 1.3. Before the start of the Competition each delegation shall present to the Control Commission:
 - payment of the balance owing or proof that this has been paid,
 - for each participant, a passport or official identity card bearing photo, surname, forename, date of birth and nationality,
 - the document certifying that each student of the school team has been enrolled at that school from the beginning of the school year 2014-2015.
- 1.4 We draw again your attention to the technical rules written in bulletin 1, concerning the age category M1 and W1! In category M1 and W1, a maximum two participants born in 1997 can be in the team but only one result of the 18 years old participants (born in 1997) will be counted in each team. The two other best results must come from the 16 (born in 1999) or 17 (born in 1998) years old participants.

2. Dates

- 2.1. Delegations are to arrive on 18th April 2015.
- 2.2. Delegations are to depart after breakfast on 24th April 2015.

- 2.3. When the distance between Antalya and the capital of a participating country on another continent exceeds 5000 kilometres the delegation may extend their stay by arriving one day earlier or leaving one day later.
- 2.4. The organisation of an extended stay for the delegation (before or after the event) is a matter for the country concerned (exception see item 2.3.). It shall not be the responsibility of the OC.
- 2.5. The organiser will be able to give you information on alternative accommodation in the area for your use outside the period of the World Championship and for those accompanying the delegation. See also 3.4

3. Board, Lodging and Services

- 3.1. Students will be accommodated in 2 to 4 bedded rooms. Adults acting as Heads of Delegation, ISF Delegate, members of the ISF Technical Commission will be accommodated in single rooms. Coaches/teachers will be accommodated in twin bedded rooms.
- 3.2. All delegations will be accommodated in the Queen's Park Tekirova http://www.queensparkresort.com/eng/

Meals will be taken in Queen's Park Tekirova. Arrival day : lunch and/or dinner (according to arrival time) Other days : breakfast – lunch – dinner. Departure day : breakfast – lunch or packed meal (according to departure time and to meals on arrival day).

- 3.3 A medical service will be available throughout the duration of the Championship.
- 3.4 Teams wishing to bring accompanying parents or other visitors, in addition to the official quota, as stated in 1.2, must provide an official letter of application from their country's School Sports Federation. The letter must be received by the Organising Committee before 1st April 2015. These parents/visitors will be accredited by the Organising Committee and will be accommodated in the event hotel.
- 3.5 The accredited parents/visitors will be afforded the use of the ISF Orienteering World Schools Championships facilities. These include:
 - accommodation in the event hotel in twin bedded rooms, including breakfast, lunch and dinner, at a cost of 88€ per person, per day
 - return transfer from the airport to the event hotel (with the teams)
 - return transport from the event hotel to the competition area, arranged by the Organising Committee.

4. General rules

These rules will apply to all teams and participants and will remain fixed for the duration of this World Schools Championship.

- 4.1. The Organising Committee will be responsible for the running and control of the World Schools Championship.
- 4.2. The World Schools Orienteering Championship is organised according to ISF rules and to current IOF rules.
- 4.3. The Organising Committee will nominate a Control Commission, a Disciplinary Commission and an Appeal Jury. Their responsibilities will be specified in Bulletin 3.
- 5. Technical rules See Bulletin 1.

5.1. Maps

The maps will be drawn according to IOF rules (scale 1: 10 000), with a contour interval of 5m. Maps to be used in the competition are newer versions of older maps. The examples shown below are the old maps.

5.2. Terrain description

a. Long distance competition – Tekirova
Map Scale: 1:10 000, Contour interval: 5 m, Map size: A4

Moderately hilly terrain, steep ascents and descents in places. Mostly conifer forest with open land in some places. The terrain is has mostly quite good runnability and visibility. Some areas have dense undergrowth. There are not many roads and paths. The highest point about 100 m and the lowest point about 10 m above sea level.

b. Middle distance competition – Beycik
Map Scale: 1:10 000, Contour interval: 5 m, Map size: A4

Hilly terrain. Many large boulders and stony ground reduce runnability. The terrain is mostly coniferous forest with limited visibility in places. There are not so many roads and paths. The highest point is about 400 m and the lowest point is about 300 m above sea level.

c. Model Event

The Model Event will be held in the northern Phaselis region, offering terrain similar to both the Middle and the Long Distance competitions. Mapping was done by the same mappers, therefore the Model Event will be ideal to get familiar with how certain features have been mapped.

The Model event will be held exactly as the competitions will take place, with 3 minute start boxes, timed controls and finish with SI download. Thus, this will serve as a full model event of what competitors should expect in the coming days.

d. Friendship Team Event

Typical urban terrain with narrow streets, many small parks, monuments and special vegetation features. Excellent runnability.

6. Note concerning Bulletin 3

- 6.1. The link to the definitive electronic entry form will be open to participating countries in good time. On this form you will be required to give the following information :
 - a. name of country
 - b. name of the organisation responsible for school sport
 - c. name of head of delegation and possible deputy head of delegation
 - d. names of teachers/coaches
 - e. names of students
 - f. dates of birth of students
 - g. names of boys' and girls' in the school teams schools
 - h. names of boys' and girls' in the selected teams
 - i. names of additional persons
 - j. precise information on travel times
 - k. particular dietary requirements
 - I. special requests
 - m. photo's

Please have this information available one month before the start of the event.

6.2. The 3rd Bulletin will give you further information about the socio-cultural programme, the definitive event programme and the composition of the Control Commission, the Disciplinary Commission and the Appeal Jury.

7. Visa information

Please check if your country needs a visa to enter Turkey.

8. Registration
