The 2026 Orienteering World Cup (OWC) will consist of the following 12 competition

In the individual World Cup, athletes are awarded World Cup points as per 2026 World Cup special rules, where winners of individual races receive 100 points and top 50 are rewarded plus 5 best competitors in the B-finals with 5-4-3-2-1 points.

The Team's World Cup points are awarded according to 2026 World Cup special rules, where relays are most important and counted together with the sum of the scores in the individual races.

Section 3: Venue, Access and Transport

3.1 Venue

Vyšší Brod

Dubbed a "treasury of cultural and natural beauty", this small town located on the banks of the River VItava is the starting point for thousands of paddlers heading down the stream via Rožmberk, Zlatá Koruna and Český Krumlov, UNESCO World Heritage Site. Above Vyšší Brod there are beautiful forests with many rocks and stones.

Lipno Region

Sometimes called the "Czech sea", Lake Lipno is set within the fascinating Šumava countryside below the ridges lining the boundary with Austria and Germany. With its length of 42 km and the maximum width of 10 km, Lipno and its surroundings offer an ideal potential for tourism. The waters of the lake attract water sports enthusiasts every year. The upper part of Lipno territory is situated in the Šumava National Park where you can hike up to the summits of around 1,300 metres.

3.2 Competition Arenas

The arenas will be situated near Vyšší Brod (no more than 20 km and 25 min of driving from the Event Centre in Vyšší Brod).

3.3 Transport / Travel Opportunities

Teams are encouraged to use their own transport throughout the whole OWC. We recommend transport by car/minibus. The nearest major international airports are Linz Blue Danube Airport (57 km from the Event Centre), Salzburg Airport (180 km), Václav Havel Airport Prague (220 km) and Vienna Airport (250 km)



Section 4: Event Centre (Office)

The Event Office will be located in the Info Centre building in the square in Vyšší Brod.

5.1 Entries and Entry Deadlines

- The deadline for **Team Size Entry** is 5 June 2026 (- 2 months).
- The deadline for **Team Names Entry** is 26 July 2026 (- 10 days).
- The deadline for Late Entries, Changes of Team Size or Team Names for accreditation is 4 August 2026 at 12:00 CET

- Number of Team officials (There is no maximum number of officials per team.)
- Number of Team athletes in the individual races (Federation Quota will be published by the IOF)



Team Names Entry

The following information shall be given:

- Name of each Team athlete by selecting from federation members in IOF Eventor
- SIAC card number of each athlete

Competition Entries

Names of the competitors and, if required, their starting group, shall be entered in IOF Eventor, on the day before an individual or relay competition.

Late Entries, Changes of Team Size or Team Names

Late entries and changes will be accepted, if possible, until 4 August 2026 at 12:00 CET. No late entries or changes will be accepted after that date. Late entries and changes will always have a defined extra cost (surcharge).

Entry Changes

- 6 June–26 July 2026 surcharge 20% on new entries, withdrawals receive 80% refund.
- 27 July-4 August 2026 surcharge 50% on new entries, withdrawals receive 50% refund.
- After 4 August 2026 12:00 CET no other entries or changes will be accepted.

Name Changes

- 27 July-4 August 2026 surcharge 10 EUR
- Changes of names for competition according to IOF rules, no fee.

Late entries and changes will always be treated equally, and must be communicated directly to the organiser on info@wcup.cz. Changes in IOF Eventor after deadlines will be made by the organiser.

Notes:

- 1. Accreditation fee for team officials covers model event, parking in the arenas and a set of competition maps.
- 2. In case of the qualification race, no start fee will be charged, but the athlete needs to pay for possible final (regardless of whether or not the athlete qualifies for it).
- 3. The pre-ordered rented SIAC cards will be handed out in the Event Office during the accreditation. A team manager shall return all rented

SIAC cards at the Event Office after the last race. Any missing or lost SIAC-card will be charged with a fee - EUR 60. SIAC cards must be ordered with the Team Size entry (5 June 2026).

5.3 Payment

Payment must be credited to the organizer's account no later than 10 days before the event starts – 26 July 2026, otherwise the competitors will not be allowed to start. Invoices will be issued during June 2026. All bank costs must be covered by the payer.

Section 6: Accommodation and Food

As the area is a very popular summer holiday destination, we strongly recommend that you book your accommodation as soon as possible. Prices are significantly higher in these summer months than the rest of the year and the capacity fills up quickly.

If you decide to make use of the accommodation offered by us, then you must send us your request no later than on **15 February 2026**.

After this deadline we cannot guarantee availability of preferred accommodation type and price.

6.1 Accommodation for Teams

We have booked the entire capacity of the apartment complex in Lipno nad VItavou (10 km from Vyšší Brod) in advance. The apartments have a different number of beds, which can be increased by extra beds (usually a sofa bed for sleeping). The table shows only the number of beds in the apartment. We will publish a detailed list with booking options at wcup.cz during the autumn.

The capacity of the entire complex is over 300 beds (+ approx. 150 extra beds). We believe that teams will be interested in this offer.

6.2 Food

Refreshments and water will be available in the quarantine and team zone in the arenas. Hot and cold food and drinks will be for sale in the arenas. The offer will include vegetarian meals.

Section 7: Embargoed Areas

According to the IOF Competition rules (§ 26.5), embargoed areas are forbidden for all potential OWC Round 3 athletes, team officials and other persons, who, through knowledge of the terrain, may influence the results of the competitions. Section 9: Rules and General Information

9.1 Competition Rules

The Competition Rules for IOF Foot Orienteering Events 2026 valid from 1 January 2026 and the World Cup 2026 Special Rules apply.

9.2 Classes and Participation Restrictions

There are two classes; Women and Men. Participation restrictions, classes and qualification system will follow the Special Rules for the 2026 World Cup in Orienteering.

9.3 Anti-doping

Doping is strictly forbidden, and the organizers of the World Cup are dedicated to supporting the Anti-Doping authorities in their work. Doping controls may be carried out any time during the competitions in accordance with the procedures described in the WADA International Standard of Testing and Investigations. The IOF Anti-Doping rules and the World Anti-Doping Code 2026 apply as of 1 January 2026. Athletes who are selected for doping control must bring an official identification (with photo) to the

doping test area. The athlete should also present the personal therapeutic use exemption (TUE) if applicable. In general, it is advisable that athletes take their ID to all competitions and events. For more information, please consult: orienteering.sport/iof/anti-doping.

9.4 Insurance

The organisers decline any liability that might occur through participation in the IOF World Cup Events and trainings. Each person participates at her/his own risk and is responsible for her/his own insurance coverage (illness and accident).

9.5 Climate and Risks

The average minimum temperature (usually the minimum temperature is noted during the night) in Vyšší Brod in August is 15.5°C. The average maximum daytime temperature is around 24.0 °C. The amount of rain in August is normal with an average of 92 mm. It rains on average a total of 13 days. Wild bees may be encountered in the areas. Ticks, carrying Tick-borne encephalitis and Lyme disease are present.

9.6 Visa

According to the current regulations citizens of some countries must obtain a visa in order to enter Czechia.

Please note that conditions of entry to Czechia can change and all Orienteering World Cup participants are advised to keep up to date of the current situation. Please visit https://mzv.gov.cz/jnp/en/information_for_aliens/index.html

9.7 Athlete's License

All athletes need to have an <u>IOF athlete's license</u> to participate at the World Cup races.

Section 11: Competition Information

11.1 Punching System

SPORTident Air+ punching will be used for all competitions. OWC participants are requested to use their own SIAC-cards as primary SIAC during the event. The organiser will offer SIAC cards for rent, they can be booked through IOF Eventor as a service with the Team Size entry (5 June 2026). Plus, there will be a back-up SIAC card provided by the organiser to every competitor, as a reserve in case of the primary SIAC failure. Detailed punching procedure will be presented in Bulletin 4.

11.2 GPS Tracking

In every race, competitors may be asked to carry a GPS tracking device. It has to be carried on the back of the competitor in an elastic harness. GPS tracking will be used for live TV production, arena production on the big video screen and live online transmission. Detailed information about allocation and picking up the GPS units will be presented in Bulletin 4.

11.3 Clothing

There are no regulations regarding clothing or shoes.








Section 12: Event Information
