The WRE event takes place during the French Sprint Championships.

## **MORNING**

Qualifications for categories W/M18-20 and W/M21-35, followed by the French championships for W/M14 and W/M16, then the OPEN categories.

Quarantine for all categories (except OPEN): Opens at 7:30 a.m./Closes at 8:00 a.m. Any runner arriving after closing time will not be accepted.







## **AFTERNOON**

(Starting at 1:30 p.m.)

French Championships Categories W/M40-45, W/M50-55, W/M60-65, W/M70-75, W/M80 and over (No quarantine),

Followed by (starting at 2:30 p.m.) the finals of the W/M18-20 and W/M21-35 qualifiers.

The following are qualified to participate in these finals:

A/ For the final of the French Sprint Championships W/M18-20:

- 1. The top 25 runners of French nationality who have qualified for the French Sprint Championships, only these runners are eligible for titles and medals.
- 2. Runners of foreign nationality licensed by the FFCO who have qualified for the French Sprint Championships and who are ranked equal to or better than the 25th French runner qualified under the previous point.
- B/ For the final of the French Sprint Championships W/M21-35 registered in the WRE:
- 1. The top 30 runners of French nationality who have qualified for the French Sprint Championships, only these runners are eligible for titles and medals.
- 2. Runners of foreign nationality licensed by the FFCO who have qualified for the French Sprint Championships and who are ranked equal to or better than the 30th French runner qualified under the previous point.
- 3. French and foreign runners registered solely for the WRE (not qualified for the French Sprint Championships) with a ranking equal to or better than the 30th French runner qualified under point 1.

Only the W/M21-35 finals count towards the World Ranking.

Quarantine for the WM 18/20 and WM 21/35 categories: Opens at 1:00 p.m./Closes at 1:30 p.m. Any runner arriving after closing time will not be accepted.

Access to the afternoon quarantine (different from the morning one) is exclusively on foot from the Arena, following specific signage (10-minute walk).








## **General Map of the Region**

## **Participation conditions:**

Access to the WRE event is open to:

- FFCO-licensed runners qualified for the French sprint championships in the M21-35 and W21-35 categories,
- French runners on the list of runners authorised to register for a WRE (https://www.ffcorientation.fr/media/cms\_page\_media/7830/listeWRE\_2025\_Dr8jXXN.pdf),
- runners of foreign nationality.

Competitors eligible to compete in the finals:

- 1. The first 30 finishers of French nationality to have qualified for the French Sprint Championships, only these runners are eligible for titles and medals.
- 2. Foreign runners with an FFCO licence who have qualified for the French Sprint Championships and who have a ranking equal to or better than the 30th French runner qualified under the previous point.
- 3. French and foreign runners, registered solely for the WRE (not qualified to take part in the French Sprint Championships) with a ranking equal to or better than the 30th French runner qualified under point 1.

**Registrations**: Before 14 October 2025 at midnight

<u>FFCO</u> license holders: On the <u>FFCO</u> website. Elite athletes wishing to participate in the WRE must also provide their IOF ID by email (<u>inscriptions@cne2025.fr</u>).

### Access to the race area MORNING:

## By train:

Access by RER D - Cesson Station

We ask you to use this option as on-site parking is limited.

From the station, the race site can be reached on foot in about 25 minutes.

## By car:

From Melun: Take the D306 (formerly the N6), towards Cesson/Savigny-le-Temple.


From Paris: Access via the A4 or the N104 (La Francilienne), approximately 45 minutes to 1 hour depending on traffic.

Signposted from: CESSON, at the D146 and D150 roundabout

Motorhomes/vans:

Overnight parking available from Friday, October 31<sup>st</sup> at 5:00 p.m. until the end of the following day. No parking available on the night of November 1<sup>st</sup> to 2<sup>nd</sup>.

# <u>Driving through Cesson and Vert-Saint-Denis is PROHIBITED</u> Access MUST be from the west via the D346/D150 roundabout









## Access to the race area AFTERNOON:

Same as in the morning, except that there is no parking reserved for quarantine.

Use lots P1, P2, P4, and P5 for cars, depending on availability.

Use lot P3 for motorhomes and campervans.

Drop-offs are also possible.

Access to quarantine MUST be on foot from the reception area located at the Arena. Allow 10 minutes to walk there, following the specific signage.

## **IMPORTANT REMINDER: ACCESS TO THE RACE AREA**

Depending on the number of parking spaces available, it may take a long time to reach the Arena.

## Visa requirements and how to obtain a visa:

The European territory of France is part of the Schengen area, which brings together several European states to form a common area for the free movement of people. The Schengen area comprises the Member States of the European Union: Austria, Belgium, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain and Sweden, as well as Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland.

Not all foreign nationals are required to have a visa to enter the Schengen area. Visa exemption depends on the applicant's nationality, possession of a valid residence permit for the Schengen area or a long-stay visa, as well as the foreign national's particular situation.

People who do not require a visa to enter the Schengen area because of their nationality include nationals of the European Union (EU), the European Economic Area (EEA) and Switzerland, as well as nationals of countries on the Schengen common list.
